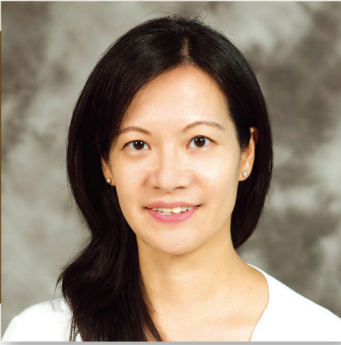

Thank you for the honour of receiving the faculty of education award.

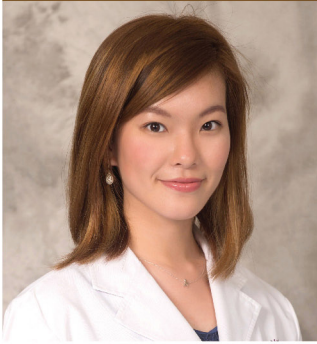

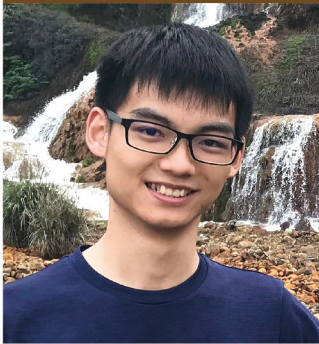

Biomedical Sciences



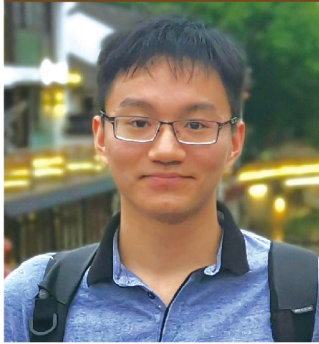

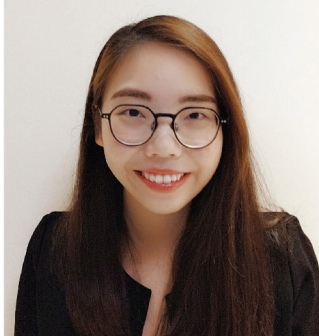
Chinese Medicine

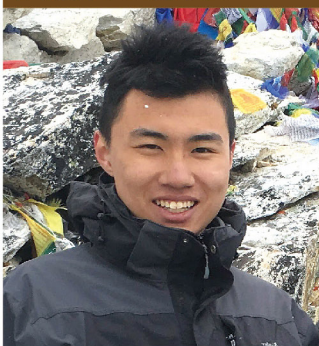
Pharmacy
