Explanatory Notes:

- 1. Students are assigned to the Humanities Stream or Social Science Stream upon admission. By the approval of the Programme Director, students may be allowed to change their stream no more than once. Any application for change of stream must be made by the end of Term 2 of Year 2.
- 2. In addition to the 6 units of University Core Chinese Language Requirement and the 9 units of the Major Chinese Language Requirement, students are required to take 6 units of additional Chinese language courses. Subject to the assessment results of the Department of Chinese Language and Literature and the approval of the Programme Board, these 6 units of additional required Chinese language courses may also be fulfilled, in part or in full, by taking courses taught in Chinese (Putonghua or Cantonese) across the University's curriculum. Courses so taken for such purposes shall not be used to fulfill other requirements.
- 3. All CHLT, CLCC, CLCE, CLCP courses taken to fulfill this Major programme requirement cannot be counted towards the fulfillment of the University Core requirements.
- 4. All CCSS courses listed above at 2000 and above level, as well as the non-CCSS courses labeled as # will be included in the calculation of Major GPA for honours classification.
- 5. Students are responsible for the extra costs incurred in exchange study. Students who are able to demonstrate a genuine financial need can apply to the Centre for an exchange scholarship. The award of the scholarship is subject to funding availability, assessment by the Centre and the approval of the Programme Director.
- 6. Exemption from the 4-unit Year 1 course of the University Core English Language Requirement may be granted if students have attained (i) qualifications as approved by the Senate or other qualifications as deemed equivalent; or (ii) satisfactory results in a placement test administered by the English Language Teaching Unit (ELTU).
- [a] Subject to the approval of the Programme Director, students with substantial previous study of the subject matter can fulfill this requirement, in part or in full, by taking other approved courses across the University's curriculum.
- [b] With the approval of the Programme Director, students fluent in Putonghua can fulfill the 12 units by successfully transferring the units of courses related to China Studies taken on a one-term exchange in any partnering institutions in other countries via an exchange programme administered by the Office of Academic Link or the Colleges. Students are responsible to check the details and to observe the deadlines when submitting the applications.
- [c] Under special circumstance, students can fulfill this requirement by taking CCSS3103 or

- 4012 subject to the recommendation of the course instructor and the approval of the Programme Director. Such approval is normally granted to students who have demonstrated advanced Chinese language level and high level of ability to undertake research in China.
- [d] CLCP4913 is offered by the Yale-China Chinese Language Centre (CLC) during the summer session for students who have completed CLCP3703 or above. Students opting for the CLCP4913 course are responsible for the relevant costs incurred.
- [e] Students are required to declare one concentration only within their respective stream. To declare a concentration, students shall apply in CUSIS in the final term of attendance.
- [f] Any courses counted towards the fulfillment of this requirement cannot be counted towards the fulfillment of any other requirements specified in the Study Scheme.
- [g] Students can take up to 3 CLCC courses for replacing the stipulated CLCP courses to fulfill the requirement of the concentration area of Language and Culture subject to the approval of the Programme Director. Students whose Putonghua proficiency level is assessed by the CLC to be at above CLCE/CLCP 4000 level are given further flexibility of taking up to 3 courses taught in Chinese and offered by the Faculty of Arts or the Departments under the Faculty of Arts for replacing the stipulated CLCP courses to fulfill the requirement of the concentration area.
