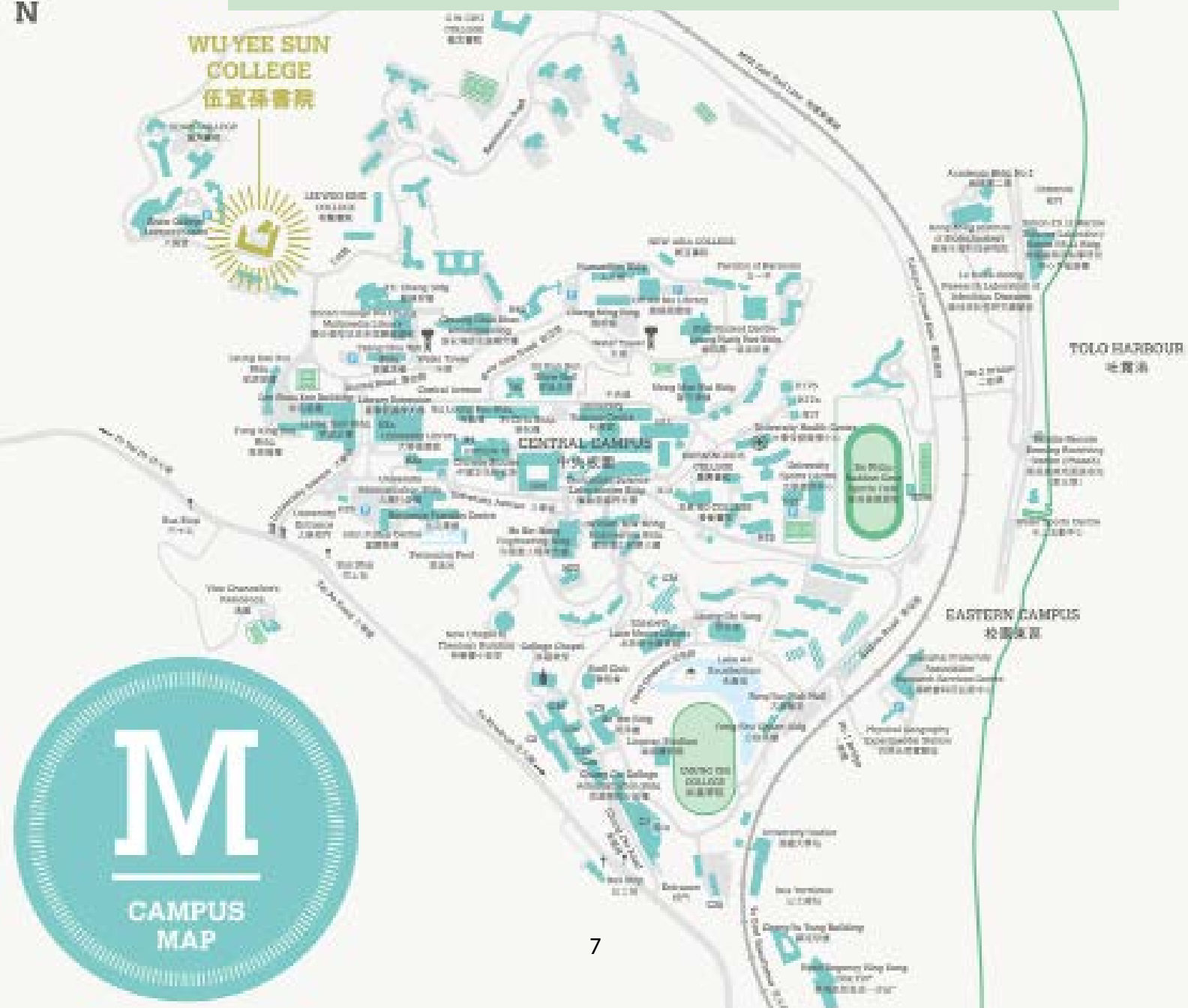

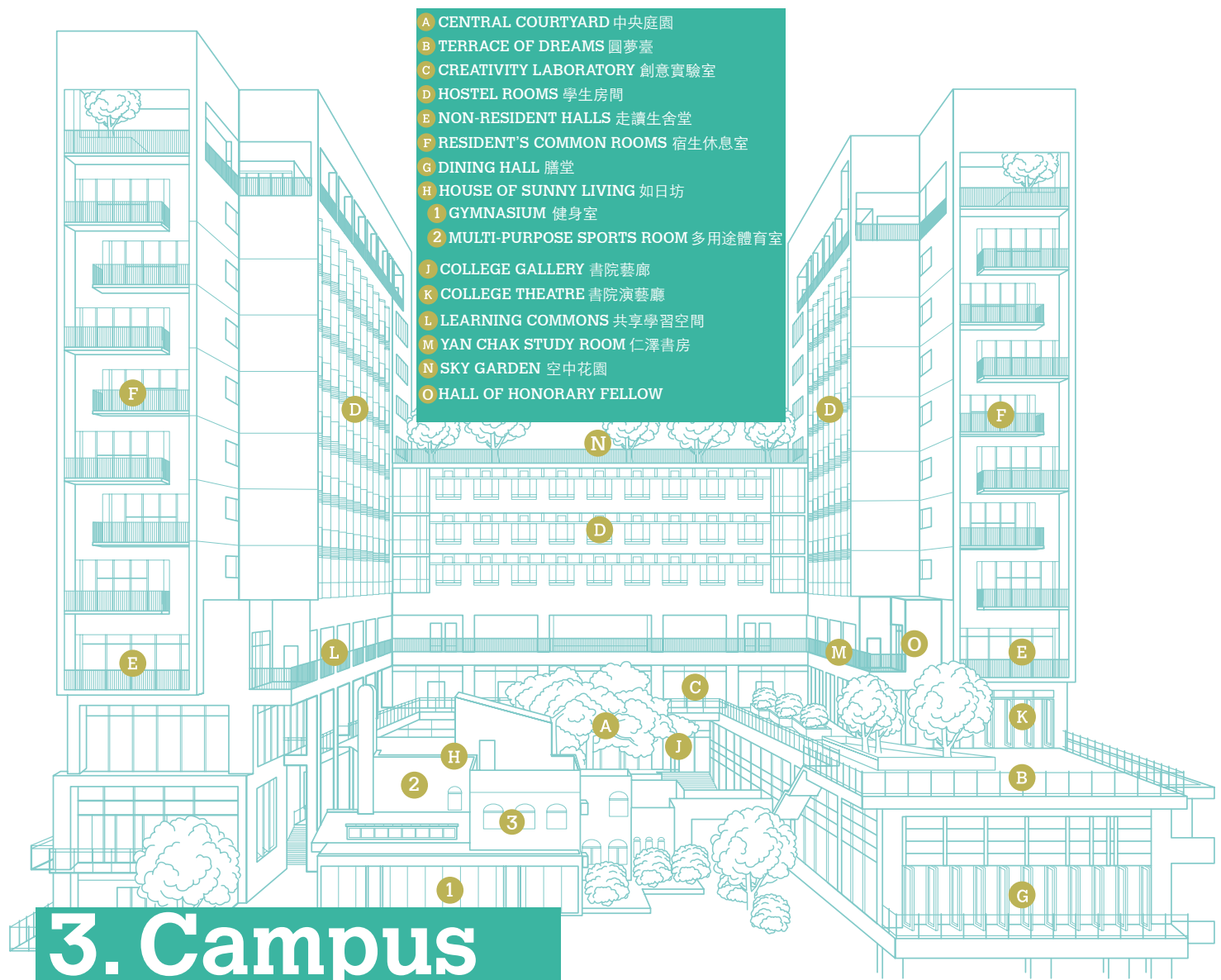

5. General Education

GEYS1010 - GEYS1010 - Creative Social Responsibility and Sustainable Development (First Year)

Time: Fridays (3:30pm – 6:15pm)

(This course will be offered in both terms. This course should be registered by students themselves through CUSIS. Please take reference to the recommendation by your major department and make sure there is enough course load when planning your course schedule in both terms.)

Course details:

This course consists of four major components:

1. Our Roles for a Sustainable Future

How can we lead a good life in a just society? How can individual actions affect events at a global scale? These are the questions every student should ask and take seriously. We will explore them through the United Nation's 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) in this section of the course.

2. Sustainable Development for Our Future

This section of the course seeks to help students to think about what their future is going to be like if humanity continues business-as-usual. Selected issues that critically impact the future of our planet will be discussed. In-depth discussion on the issues, including responses from various sectors of the society around the world, will be guided by the SDG Framework.

3. Sustainable Development of Cities and Communities to Ensure Good Health and Well-being

This section of the course enhances students' knowledge on impact of urban development on health and well-being by making use of concept of Healthy City to illustrate socio-economic and political determinants of health. It aims to broaden the students' concept of health and well-being to address issues of sustainable urban development. This section focuses on 2 key SDG's, Good Health and Well-being (SDG 3) and Sustainable Cities and Communities (SDG 11). Other determinants for health and well-being, such as reduction of poverty (SDG 1) and reduction of inequality (SDG 10), and health justice (SDG 16), will also be discussed.

4. Creativity and Design Thinking for a Sustainable Future

This section of the course examines the topic of creativity and design thinking. The key question to be discussed is how we can put design creativity to good use in our everyday life as well as in projects that we choose to pursue to create a world of peace and prosperity.

Lectures are supplemented by a variety of activities to enhance students' exposure to related topics discussed in class, including cultural walk, movie appreciation and more. Students could register for their desired activities at term start.

GEJC1020 – The Hong Kong Story (First Year)

**For non-Cantonese speaking students only*

Time: Fridays (3:30pm – 6:15pm)

*(This course will be pre-assigned to non-Cantonese speaking students. If you would like to take the Cantonese-based course GEYS1010, please inform the College about your decision. The course is offered in **term one ONLY**. Please take reference to the recommendation by your major department and make sure there is enough course load when planning your course schedule in both terms.)*

Course details:

From the crown jewel of the British Empire to the "spoiled" SAR of the PRC, the Hong Kong story has undergone many ups and downs, twists and turns. Designed from a sociological perspective, but specifically for students without sociological background or much background knowledge about Hong Kong, this course shall guide them through the journey of Hong Kong and its people so far. It will pick up popular images about Hong Kong, such as "a laissez-faire economic miracle", "the safest place in the world", or "the land of opportunity", evaluating their validities or tracing their origins and implications.

Integrating experiential learning and e-learning strategies, this course should offer students a range of new learning experiences and new angles of approaching the society that we are living in.

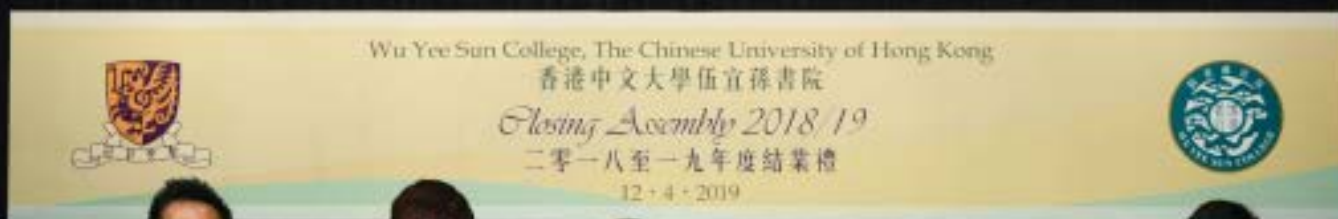

8. Learning Path at College

As part of the College orientation programme, the [*College Student Advisor Scheme](#) is especially designed to help new students settle in College life. 8-10 students will be matched with 1-2 advisors, who are College staff members, to interact on academic, personal and College life matters in informal gatherings. Our advisors come from different faculties and departments in the university. Students will first meet their advisors in College-organized meetings in September to October, 2020. Subsequent meetings will be initiated by students. By meeting at least once a term, freshmen can continue to seek guidance from advisors on setting personal goals.

When new students entered their second year of College life, they are eligible to join [Mentorship Programme](#), which serves as the next stage of advice and guidance. The introduction of group-to-group mentor-mentee model over a period of two years provides Year 2 and Year 3 students with the opportunities to enrich their people skills and career development from various fields of experts. The mentors' stories of success and challenges will inspire the mentees upon the journey of realizing their personal goals.



The College also provides ample opportunities and support for students to extend their exposure. While [Internship Programme](#) let students lay solid foundation for their future career, various [self-initiated project funding schemes](#) such as Sunny Passion Programme and Rance Lee Award support students to realize their wild ideas.

12. House of Sunny Living

The establishment of “House of Sunny Living” is Wu Yee Sun College’s initiative for promotion of healthy living style. It aims to transform our students into a **positive and radiating energy force to make the world a better place**. Our whole person approach starts with helping students to **discover their passions, dreams and sense of purpose in life** so that they can **form their own identity** and develop a **character of integrity and perseverance**.

The House adopts a holistic three-pronged community approach by integrating three dimensions of “health and spiritual well-being”, “sports for life” and “go green and lead the society” to target the well-being of the body, mind and spirit of our students and encourage their contributions to the environment and society.

Health and Spiritual Well-being

Relaxation workshops such as zendala workshop and mindfulness practice designed for strengthening and training for mind and body can be found here. You can also learn to eat wisely through joining our healthy cooking class.

Sports for Life

Diversified sports activities such as Yoga Class, Multi-culturalism x Sports – Kabaddi and Sunny Relay Race are offered to promote healthy lifestyle and sports fun. To motivate students to establish routine exercise practice, certified fitness trainers are stationed at our gymnasium to provide personal fitness advice and lead fitness class.

Go Green and Lead the Society

Environmental conservation is an essential component of social responsibility. The College has thus been promoting green atmosphere to increase students’ sense of responsibility to the environment.





Acting out the College slogan “Go Green! Be Sunny!”, our College offers an array of green activities to raise students’ awareness on environmental protection. For instance, our College students formed a Green Team comprising of members committed to greening the College campus and promoting green messages to their peers, communities as well as the general public.
