Dorothy J. Solinger, Professor of Political Science at the University of California, Irvine has published, edited and co-edited numerous books. The most recent are Contesting Citizenship in Urban China: Peasants, the State and the Logic of the Market (California, 1999, winner of the Joseph R. Levenson prize of the Association for Asian Studies); States' Gains, Labor's Losses: China, France and Mexico Choose Global Liaisons (Cornell, 2009, selected as an "Outstanding Academic Title" by Choice magazine); and Socialism Vanquished, Socialism Challenged: Eastern Europe and China, 1989-2009 (Oxford, 2012), co-edited with Nina Bandelj. She has authored nearly 100 articles and book chapters; currently, she is working on China's urban poor. She was Chair of the China and Inner Asia Council of the Association for Asian Studies (2013-14) and is currently Distinguished Visiting Professor at the Institute of Chinese Studies and the Department of Government and Public Administration at CUHK.
