superintend	\,sü-p(ə-)rin-'tend\	to direct or manage (something, such as a project or activity)
chorus	\'kôr-əs\	a large group of singers
cognitive	\'käg-nə-tiv\	capable of being reduced to empirical factual knowledge
denomination	\di,nämə'nāshən\	a religious group
hitchhike	\'hich-,hīk\	to travel by securing free rides from passing vehicles
malice	\'ma-ləs\	desire to cause pain, injury, or distress to another
