### Underground Sub-soil Drainage Works for Library Extension & Temporary Pedestrian Diversion at Central Steps

The underground sub-soil drainage works for the construction of the Library Extension commenced on 24 Jun at Central Steps. The works are expected to be completed in mid-October 2010. The working hours are 7:00 am to 7:00 pm from Monday to Saturday.

For construction maneuvering and safety purpose, temporary closure of Central Steps is required to construct the drainage works. Temporary pedestrian diversion was implemented and directional signs were posted at various locations. Railing/hoardings have also been erected at locations

as required to protect the campus users.

#### AED at University Swimming Pool

Have you ever come across someone suffering from a sudden cardiac arrest? If he cannot receive immediate medical treatment, his life is at great risk! Today, as an ordinary man without medical knowledge, you can give a helping hand to the victim who has the above terrible experience.

Automated external defibrillator (AED), designed for layman's use and allows non-medically trained people to treat sudden cardiac arrest, has already been installed in the University Swimming Pool. The lifeguards who have received proper and formal training will utilise this device to automatically analyse a person's heart rhythm and accurately detect if he suffers a sudden cardiac arrest, and provide defibrillation therapy accordingly.
