



DBS: Connie Cao, Management Associate, Bachelor Degree of Business Management 2011 I joined DBS as a Management Associate (MA) after completing my Bachelor Degree of Business Management from CUHK in 2011. If graduating from CUHK is a milestone of my student life, joining DBS as MA embarks a brand new learning and development journey for my career.







The two-year MA programme in DBS is very structured and well designed. It comprises three rotations (7 months each) in three different departments within the bank. I am going through Institutional Banking – Risk Management - Technology & Operations. Through rotations, not only can I get to learn daily banking operations, I can also gain a holistic view of the whole banking business from an end-to-end perspective, which can fast track my career development in the banking field.

In addition to the rotations, I also got the exciting opportunities to go to Singapore for training, which was led by Swiss Asia Banking School, a renowned international training consultant for banking industry. In Singapore, I met other MAs from six emerging markets in the region: China, India, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Taiwan and Singapore. We worked together on a lot of challenging projects, from which we were inspired by different opinions and gained the valuable experience to work in a cross-cultural environment. In additional to the intensive and enriching banking related trainings, we also attended team building outreach camp and workshop to sharpen soft skills such as presentation skills and project management. After training, all the MAs become good friends. This bonding builds great network for us in the region for our career in DBS too.

What I enjoyed most in the programme is that I am always learning new things and continuously being challenged to test my limit. Every time when I go to a new team, I will be given a project on a subject I might have never heard of. The process of tackling the project is full of learning opportunities. In DBS, even you are a junior staff, you still have the chance to drive change and make a difference. As long as you do a good job, people will see and recognise. In one of the projects, I worked with another four MAs to revamp an internal online platform . It was not an easy task for us since we had little experience in website revamping and the schedule was very tight. However, we managed to overcome the challenges and delivered the new platform in time. Some colleagues gave us very positive feedback and our project team was even awarded DBS Spot Award, an internal award to recognise outstanding contribution of staff.

My Advice



Reminder: You Are Reminded NOT To Invlove in any unlicensed Guesthouse Operation

In view of a recent court case regarding the conviction of three Mainland post-graduate students for operating an unlicensed guesthouse, the Home Affairs Department would like to bring your attention to the followings:

Before commencing a hotel or guesthouse business in Hong Kong, a license issued under the Hotel and Guesthouse Accommodation Ordinance shall be obtained. Under the Ordinance, "hotel/guesthouse" means any premises being held out by the occupier, proprietor or tenant for providing sleeping accommodation at a fee with a tenancy term of less than 28 continuous days.

Under section 5 of the Ordinance, any person operates, keeps, manages or otherwise has control of a guesthouse without a valid guesthouse licence commits an offence and will lead to a criminal record. Any person who is convicted for operating an unlicensed guesthouse is liable to imprisonment. The maximum penalty upon conviction is a \$200,000 fine and imprisonment for two years, and a fine of \$20,000 for each day during which the offence continues. According to records, heavier sentences for unlicensed guesthouse operations have been passed by the courts in the recent years. 溫馨提示: 切勿涉及任何經營無牌旅館事宜

鑑於新近有關三名內地碩士生因經營無牌旅館而被定罪一事,民政事務總署特別作出以下提醒:

凡在香港開展旅館業務,必須先領取根據《旅館業條例》發出的牌照。根據《條例》,"旅館"指任何處所,其佔用人、東主或租客顯示會提供收費的住宿地方,而出 租期少於連續 28 天。

根據《條例》第5條,凡任何人沒有有效旅館牌照而經營、開設、管理或以其他方式控制旅館,即屬犯罪,並會留下刑事記錄。違者一經定罪,可被判監禁,最高可處 罰款 20,000 元及監禁兩年,並可就罪行持續期間的每一天另處罰款 20,000 元。根據記錄,近年法院加重有關經營無牌旅館的刑罰,詳情請參閱牌照事務處網站 www.hadla.gov.hk。
