#### Student Counselling and Development Service



Mental Health First Aid is the help given to someone developing a mental health problem or in a mental health crisis before appropriate professional treatment is received. Participants who complete the 12-hour MHFA course will be issued a "Mental Health First Aid Course Certificate" by the Hong Kong Mental Health Association and acknowledged by ORYGEN Research Center of the Department of Psychiatry at University of Melbourne.

The Course will enable participants to:

- <sup>cg</sup> Learn about the basic knowledge of depression, anxiety disorders, psychosis and substance use disorder.
- Anticipate the possible crises which may arise from these mental health problems and proceed with the necessary intervention.

Learn about community resources and help the person involved to seek professional treatment and make use of suitable resources.
