# The Chinese University of Hong Kong M.A. in Translation





The M.A. in Translation Programme aims at enhancing students' language competence and translation skills, as well as deepening their understanding of translation theories and related cultural topics.

Our professors and instructors possess research interests and expertise in different areas of translation studies and practice. On the other hand, our students come from various places with different academic and occupational backgrounds. This diverse composition brings about fruitful classroom interactions.

The programme is suitable for people from all disciplines and prepares graduates for careers in different sectors of the society, including education, public services, publishing, mass media, and the business world.

#### **HISTORY**

Established in 1972, the Department of Translation at The Chinese University of Hong Kong offers B.A. in Translation, M.A. in Translation, as well as two research programmes, M.Phil. and Ph.D. in Translation.

The M.A. in Translation Programme was established in 1984 as the first of its kind in the territory. It expanded from a part-time programme offering only 4 courses to under 20 part-time students, to one that offers over 30 courses with one hundred students of both full-time and part-time modes.

# **FACILITIES**

The Department is equipped with a simultaneous interpreting laboratory and a language-cumcomputer laboratory to facilitate the teaching and learning of interpreting and computer-aided translation. The new simultaneous interpreting laboratory is installed with the widely-acclaimed Brahler DIGIMIC system and the Sanako Lab 100 language training system. The interior setting of the laboratories simulates the actual work environment of interpreters.

# AWARDS

The Best Academic Performance Award and High Academic Performance Award are set up to recognize students with outstanding performance. Certificates and cash prizes are awarded to the top students.



#### INTERPRETING STUDY TRIP AT UNITED NATIONS OFFICE

In summer every year, selected interpreting students put their interpreting skills to the test by joining study trips to the United Nations Office. Through this valuable opportunity, students not only learn skills in handling cultural issues, master knowledge of world affairs and UN-specific terminology, they can also observe professionals at work in international conferences. Students went to Bangkok, Thailand in 2017 and Vienna, Austria in 2018 and 2019 to join UN meetings on various topics, including economic, social and environmental issues and corruption.

#### **General Admission Requirements**

- graduated from a recognized university and obtained a Bachelor's degree, normally with honours not lower than Second Class; or
- graduated from an honours programme of a recognized university with a Bachelor's degree, normally achieving an average grade of not lower than "B"; or
- completed a course of study in a tertiary educational institution and obtained professional or similar qualifications equivalent to an honours degree.

#### **English Language Requirements**

To fulfill the University's minimum English language requirements for admission to postgraduate programmes, applicants should have:

- a. obtained a degree from a university in Hong Kong or taken a degree programme of which the medium of instruction was English; or
- b. achieved scores in one of the following English Language tests as indicated:
  - i. TOEFL: 550 (Paper-based)/79 (Internet-based);
  - ii. IELTS (Academic): 6. 5;
  - iii. GMAT (Verbal): Band 21; or
- c. obtained a pass grade in English in one of the following examinations:
  - i. Hong Kong Advanced Level Examination (AS Level);
  - ii. Hong Kong Higher Level Examination;
  - iii. CUHK Matriculation Examination;
  - iv. General Certificate of Education Examination (GCE) Advanced Level (A-Level)/Advanced Subsidiary Level (AS-Level); or
- d. achieved Level 4 or above in the English Language subject of the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) Examination; or
- e. obtained a recognized professional qualification, provided that the examination was conducted in English.

**Deadlines:** Priority Round: 15 January 2021 Final Round: 28 February 2021

\* Applications are processed on a rolling basis until all places are filled. If places are no longer available after the Priority Round, subsequent applications received may not be considered.
