<b>Course Title</b>	New Practical Japanese1/2
<p><b><u>Learning Outcomes</u></b></p> <p>After completing JASP1450 and JAS1460, students are expected to be able to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. use verbs of state (iru, aru), directional verbs (kuru, iku, kaeru) , and activity verbs (taberu, nomu, and benkyoosuru).</li> <li>2. count and use appropriate quantifiers.</li> <li>3. use na-adjectives and i-adjectives, and be able to conjugate according to the given situation.</li> <li>4. use past and present tense, and continuous and resultative aspect appropriately.</li> <li>5. use purpose expressions, such as V+ni.</li> <li>6. use direct and indirect speech</li> <li>7. ask when one doesn't know how to read and what to say (~nan to iimasuka ~doo omoimasuka)</li> <li>8. use secondary aspect of ~te aru</li> <li>9. use particles of wa, ga, ni, de, and o.</li> <li>10. speak with correct pronunciation.</li> </ol>	
<p><b><u>Course Syllabus</u></b></p> <p>JAS1450 and 1460 are consecutive one-semester courses designed to provide comprehensive training in reading, listening, speaking and writing in Japanese at the elementary level for elective students with an emphasis on elementary grammar.</p> <p>Students are required to attend four hours of language lessons per week and are expected to spend two hours on homework each week. Language lessons are conducted in four languages: Japanese, English, Cantonese and Mandarin. Teachers use various kinds of conversational practices based on natural conversation emphasizing the use of the language in context.</p> <p>After completing the courses, students are expected to reach novice-middle level, and continue to enrol in the intermediate level language courses.</p>

### **Grading justifications:**

Students will be graded on their performances in five areas: translation, grammar, reading, listening and oral skills. Grades will be determined by several review tests, one written exam and one oral test. The written tests examine how well the students master grammatical structures and their usages, and oral tests examine the students' ability to speak Japanese appropriately in natural contexts. The review tests are given by each class teachers according to the progress of the studies. The test content includes grammar, vocabulary, writing and speech et cetera.

Since JASP1450 and JASP1460 are language courses, we take students' participation seriously. When a student is absent for more than 1/3 of the classes in a course, the student will automatically receive an "F" grade and have to repeat the course in the following year.

### **Lessons:**

Language lessons are conducted interactively and students are expected to participate in class actively. Instead of the traditional one-directional way of teaching a language, teachers use conversational activities which focus on using the language in context. Teachers also use role play, games, and short presentations (such as introducing oneself) in order to improve students' conversational skills in Japanese.

### **Oral Test:**

Oral tests will be held once a term in JASP1450 and in JASP1460. In JASP1450, the oral test will be in early December right after completing the taught lessons. For the second term, the oral test for JASP1460 will be held in late April.

### **Review Tests:**

In JASP1450, the review tests cover L1~L11, and in JASP1460, the tests cover L12~L24. The review tests evaluate students' progress in grammar and vocabulary.

### **Final Exam:**

It consists of four parts: (1) translation and vocabulary, (2) grammar, (3) reading, and (4) listening, and comprehensively evaluates a student's progress.
