Dr. WANG Shaoguang is Chairperson and Professor of Department of Government and Public Administration, CUHK, and the Director of the Universities Service Centre for China Studies. He is also a Changjiang Professor in the School of Public Policy and Management at Tsinghua University, non-official member of the HKSAR's Commission on Strategic Development, and chief editor of The China Review, an interdisciplinary journal on greater China. He taught at Yale University in the United States from 1990 to 2000. His research interests include political economy, comparative politics, fiscal politics, democratization, and economic and political development in former socialist countries and East Asian countries. In addition, he has contributed to numerous edited volumes and journals.

He taught at The Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy, Tufts University (1986-1996) and was a Postdoctoral Fellow at Harvard University in 1984-85. His Ph.D. is from The University of Michigan in Political Science (1983). He was an exchange student at Peking University in 1974-76, and lived in Nanjing in 1980-81, 1986 and 1991-92. His four books include *Internationalizing China: domestic interests and global linkages* (2002), *China's Brain Drain to the United States* (Berkeley, 1995) and his edited books include *Globalization and China's Reforms* (Routledge, 2007). He writes on China's relationship to the outside world, China's

Dennis Tao Yang is Professor of Economics at the Chinese University of Hong Kong. He is also Senior Fellow of the Center for China in the World Economy at Tsinghua University and Senior Advisor to The Conference Board China Center for Economics and Business. Prior to his current position, he was a faculty member in economics at Duke University and Virginia Tech. He has also served as a consultant to international organizations such as The World Bank. Professor Yang's main research interests are economic development and growth, labor and demographic economics, and the economics of China and transition. He has published widely in leading academic journals including American Economic Review, Journal of Political Economy, Economic Journal, Journal of Monetary Economics and Journal of Development Economics. He is the co-editor of two books on economic reforms in China and currently serves on the Editorial Boards of several international economic journals. Professor Yang obtained his undergraduate degree at the University of California Los Angeles and his Ph.D. in economics from the University of Chicago.

Daniel A. Bell is professor of ethics and political theory at Tsinghua University (Beijing). He was born in Montreal, educated at McGill and Oxford, has taught in Singapore and Hong Kong, and has held research

Life in a Changing Society (Princeton University Press, 2008), Beyond Liberal Democracy: Political Thinking for an East Asian Context (Princeton University Press, 2006; Chinese translation published in 2009 by Shanghai Sanlian Chubanshe), East Meets West: Human Rights and Democracy in East Asia (Princeton University Press, 2000), and Communitarianism and Its Critics (Oxford University Press, 1993). He is the editor of Confucian Political Ethics (Princeton University Press, 2007) and the coeditor of six books. He writes on Chinese politics and philosophy for Du Shu, Dissent, Newsweek, and the Guardian's Comment Is Free blog, he has published comments in the New York Times, Huanxiu Shibao, the International Herald Tribune, and the Toronto Globe and Mail, and he has been interviewed on CCTV, NPR, BBC, and CBC.
