THEO5962 Celebrating the Lord's Supper and Baptism

(Special Topics on Worship and Sacred Music I)

Course Description:

This course explores the biblical and theological understanding, historical shaping, and practical development of the Lord's Supper and Baptism at the church. Special attention will be given to practical issues on celebrating them.

Learning Outcomes:

By the end of this course, students are able to:

- 1. Articulate the biblical, theological, and historical perspectives on the Lord's Supper and Baptism.
- 2. Celebrate the Lord's Supper and Baptism in an effective and confident way reflecting theological and practical perspective of the Lord's Supper and Baptism.
- 3. Demonstrate scholarly informed perspectives on issues associated with the Lord's Supper and Baptism today.

Course Requirement:

- 1. Class participation (50%): Attendance and Participation in class discussion
- 2. Term Paper (40%): on a topic related to the Lord's Supper or Baptism [4,000 words, due: April 30]
- 3. Reflection Paper (10%): on *Baptism, Eucharist and Ministry, 10-17* [2~3 pages, due: February 28]

Assignment Grading Rubrics:

All assignments will be graded according to student's demonstration of:

- 1. Research effort and ability with using source materials and lectures including class discussions
- 2. Quality of analysis of the issue and arguments with clear statement of thesis and its appropriate outcomes
- 3. Provision of scholarly application to the practice of the Lord's Supper and Baptism
- 4. Contribution to the class discussion
