CBRC in collaboration with RTHK to explore the challenges parents encounter when raising bilingual and multilingual children

Hong Kong is a multilingual society where great attention is given to the learning of two or more languages in children. Parenting (Episode 1), produced by RTHK in collaboration with Childhood Bilingualism Research Centre at the Department of Linguistics and Modern Languages at CUHK, explores the challenges parents encounter when raising bilingual and multilingual children and provides useful suggestions and recommendations.

The HKSAR promotes the language policy of biliteracy and trilingualism: how are the three languages, Cantonese, English and Mandarin positioned vis-à-vis each other in the Hong Kong speech community?

- What do scholars and researchers think about the development of two or more languages in children?
- What are the advantages of childhood bilingualism and multilingualism?
- What challenges do parents come across when raising bilingual and trilingual children? What kind of environment nurtures childhood bilingualism and multilingualism?
- What inspiration can parents get from the successful cases of multilingual children?
