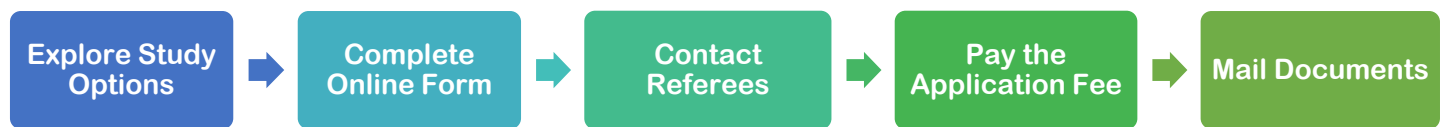

2 Application Procedures



2.1 Explore Study Options

Applicants are advised to browse the School's [webpage](#) to acquire programme information and pay attention to the eligibility for applications below:

Master of Theology (MTheol)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A recognized MDIV/BD or a good MA academic degree in Christian Studies. • Candidates must fulfill at least one of the following English proficiency requirements: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Achieved Grade D or above in the English Language subject of HKALE; ○ Achieved Level 3 or above in the English Language subject of HKDSE Examination; or ○ Achieved 5.5 or above in IELTS (Academic); or ○ Obtained a degree from a university in Hong Kong or an English-speaking country; or ○ Other equivalent qualifications.
Doctor of Theology (DTheol)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A recognized MTheol or first rate Master's degree in Christian Studies. • Candidates must fulfill at least one of the following English proficiency requirements: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Achieved Grade C or above in the English Language subject of HKALE; ○ Achieved Level 4 or above in the English Language subject of HKDSE Examination; or ○ Achieved 6 or above in IELTS (Academic); or ○ Obtained a degree from a university in Hong Kong or an English-speaking country; or ○ Other equivalent qualifications.

2.2 Complete Online Form

Applicants must (i) provide personal particulars, academic qualifications, working experience, church and referee information and (ii) upload a scanned copy of the following supporting documents via the online [application form](#).

Upon successful submission, an e-mail acknowledge will be issued to the applicant immediately. Applicants who cannot receive the e-mail acknowledgment should contact the Divinity School for assistance.

7 Research proposal	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Applicable to Doctor of Theology programme only The content of the proposal should be limited to 2000 words which includes: (i) Provisional title; (ii) Research questions to be addressed, (iii) Research objectives; (iv) Relationship of the proposed research to the published literature and to current research in the field; (v) Indication of the contribution to knowledge that the thesis is anticipated to make; (vi) Methods to be used in the research; (vii) Provisional timetable for the research; (viii) Details of the applicant's previous work in the proposed field; (ix) Bibliography of sources identified as of relevance to the proposal.
8 Writing Sample	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Applicable to Master of Theology and Doctor of Theology programmes only Length of the academic paper, which must be solely written by the applicant, should not exceed 25 pages

2.3 Contact Referees

Applicants should contact their referees and request their referees to complete recommendation forms. As a general principle, the referee should not be an immediate family member of the applicant.

Applicants should download the recommendation form at the School's [webpage](#). **Part I** should be completed by applicants while **Part II** should be completed by referees.

Referees must return the duly completed forms to the Admissions Panel of Divinity School directly by e-mail (e-mail address: admissions@theology.cuhk.edu.hk) or by post (mailing address: LG1/F, President Chi-tung Yung Memorial Building, Divinity School of Chung Chi College, The Chinese University of Hong Kong, Shatin, New Territories, Hong Kong).

2.4 Pay the Application Fee

The application fee is **HK\$300**. The fee is non-refundable regardless of whether the application is successful. Applicants may pay the fee by one of the following methods:

- **ATM / Counter Payment**

Quote applicant name and programme applied on the bank deposit form/ATM customer advice. Submit the original receipt to Divinity School of Chung Chi College by mail. Scanned documents would not be accepted.

- **Cheque**

Submit a crossed cheque payable to “The Chinese University of Hong Kong” with the applicant name and programme applied on the back by mail.

2.5 Mail the Documents

The following **original(s)** MUST be sent to Divinity School by mail before the application deadline. Otherwise, the applications may not be further processed.

- The **original(s)** of official transcript(s) sent from post-secondary educational institutions or theology schools (if any)
- The **original(s)** of official IELTS/TOEFL score report(s) sent from the examination authorities (if any)^

3 Points to Note

3.1 Interview Arrangements

The Divinity School will thoroughly review the application documents of each applicant. Shortlisted applicants will be invited for interviews scheduled on 24 April 2021 (*for non-local applicants*) or 8 May 2021 (*for local applicants*). Non-local applicants may opt for online video interview. Generally speaking, e-mail invitations will be sent to shortlisted applicants individually around 3-5 working days before the said interviews. Applicants should check their mailboxes regularly to receive up-to-date information from the Divinity School.

3.2 Student Hostel Arrangements

To enhance interactions among students, residence in the student hostel is mandatory for (i) unmarried students of the full-time Bachelor of Divinity programme and (ii) unmarried non-local students unless otherwise approved. Due to limited hostel places, on-campus accommodation would not be arranged for married students and their family members normally.

Due to COVID-19, there may be further adjustments for the student hostel arrangements. Residents will be informed of the latest hostel policy via e-mail before September 2021.

3.3 Equal Opportunities

The School is committed to offering equal opportunities to all applicants. To enable us to meet the needs of all students, applicants are invited to indicate on the application form whether they have any special health conditions (e.g. speech impediment, visual impairment, hearing impairment, physical challenges or other specific learning difficulties) which need special assistance. The School may approach applicants subsequently to obtain further details so as to facilitate early planning.

3.4 Fees

There will be upward adjustments of the tuition fees for students admitted in the 2021-22 academic year. Upon approval by the university authorities, the new tuition fees will be released at the School's webpage by the end of January 2021. Applicants may refer to the URL <https://www.theology.cuhk.edu.hk/en/admissions/fees> for further details.

In addition to the prescribed tuition fee, students would need to set aside money for other items including meals, books, transport and other expenses. Applicants are advised to plan early and plan ahead to ensure that they have sufficient funds to cover all the above expenses while studying in the School. Applicants with financial needs may approach their family and friends, affiliated churches or other related institutions for financial assistance.

3.5 Personal Information Collection Statement

The personal data provided by applicants will be used by the School for the purpose of processing the admission applications. All information provided, when no longer required, will be destroyed. Meanwhile, for successful applicants, relevant data will become part of student record upon enrolment in a programme, and may be used for purposes in accordance with the procedures of the University.
