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PREFACE

This data book is one of the products of the Hawker Study Programme carried out by the Social Research Centre, the Chinese University of Hong Kong. The study is primarily funded by the Hong Kong Lotteries Fund, and is subsidized by the Chinese University of Hong Kong. The research programme is designed, on the one hand, to stimulate research on important local problems, and on the other, to provide local agencies with a sound factual basis for policy formulation and administration.

This data book was complied with three purposes. First, we hope that the presentation will serve as a basis for discussion with those interested in hawkers and problems of their relocation and, perhaps, as a starting point of new ideas. Second, we prepare to use the data presented in this compilation to work on a more sophisticated report to be published later. Thus, the presentation here will also serve as a preliminary analysis prior to the forthcoming one. Third, on the assumption that readers may wish to analyse or re-analyse the basic data for specific purposes, we have given explicit attention to research design and methodology. The nature of the collected data is discussed at some length, and a set of tables with all the demographic and socio-economic characteristics of hawkers is classified and complied in this work.

This data book is based on the data collected from a survey conducted in the summer of 1972 for the purpose of ascertaining

the features of hawkers in the metropolitan city of Hong Kong.

Although the investigator accepts full responsibility for the accuracy of the factual materials in this data book, he would be remiss if he failed to acknowledge the "joint" nature of this undertaking. The members of our Hawker Study Programme provided valuable suggestions at the several stages of the study. The overall design of the study was handled by the investigator. I am indebted also to H.K. Tsoi, for his competent and unstinting efforts as research associate on the project. Finally, a word of thanks and appreciation must be extended to all who assisted in the survey and in the preparation of this data book.

BACKGROUND LEADING TO THE RESEARCH

Relocation of hawkers is the policy most often applied to hawkers in Hong Kong as well as in other Asian cities. However, such hawker relocation programmes have been much criticized. As mentioned in T.G. McGee's report on a visit to several South-eastern Asian cities, the relocation of hawkers has been the most frequently tried, and the most frequently unsuccessful, policy applied to hawkers in the Asian cities.¹ It is also clear that Government relocation of hawkers in Hong Kong is not infrequently met with resentment and resistance.² In fact, it is both logical and realistic to assume that hawkers, being deliberately and artificially placed into a new environment, will find themselves facing a number of new problems which often call for a high degree of adaptation and adjustment.

The impact of such changes and problems associated with them, both at a time and over time are among important questions to raise. Such issues call for almost immediate answers, as rising resentment about relocation among the hawkers has been observed in many recent clearance operations.³ Such resentment is likely to intensify as more hawkers may have to be relocated as a result of the implementation of the new hawker policy and the increasing urban renewal projects. A closer examination of such factors as the commuting pattern of hawkers, financial, economic and social factors and others, may provide some concrete information on the problem.

Only by insuring mutual adaptation and, often, compromise, of

the parties involved can planned urban change be accomplished without serious hazard to human welfare. Therefore a better understanding of the hawkers' attitudes towards relocation and the factors affecting the formulation of such attitudes may help future official relocation planning, and of course, the lesson learned from Hong Kong may also be of use to other developing cities where hawking has always remained a grave problem.

THE RESEARCH DESIGN

The Universe of the Study

In order to set the survey findings into a general framework, it is necessary first to define the universe of the study. The definition of "hawker" is somewhat complicated and confusing. T.G. McGee has suggested that one may define hawkers in three ways: conceptually, culturally, and legally.⁴ This differential definition of the hawkers posed some difficulties in achieving a probability sample of hawkers.

In the social context of Hong Kong, people have most commonly assumed that "hawker" means an individual who conducts business in a "public way" (e.g. day and night hawkers in Lion Rock Road, Kowloon City) or within a specially constituted area labelled as a bazaar (e.g. night hawker bazaar in front of Macao Ferry). For administrative purposes, the Government defines hawkers as one who conducts business in any "public place" by selling merchandise or offering his personal services and skills in handicraft to others.⁵ The above two conceptions of "hawker" imply characteristics of fixed location of business and of no limitation on the capital involved. They differ significantly from the use of the traditional Chinese term "siu fan" 小販, meaning a pedlar whose location is mobile and whose capital is meagre. Here in this survey, for practical reasons, we tried to use both cultural and legal definition to delineate the universe of our study.

Thus, hawkers of different legal statuses (i.e. licenced and unlicenced hawkers); different operative units (i.e. fixed pitch stall hawker, fixed pitch pedlars and mobile hawkers); different operative sizes (i.e. standard unit);⁶ and different types of commodity sold (i.e. raw foodstuff, cooked foods, fruits, confectioneries snacks and spiced foods, emporium goods, toys and books, household wares, services, newspapers and others) are all included in the universe of our study.

Furthermore, this study focused only on the metropolitan area of Hong Kong. It is thus only tried to reveal the socio-economic characteristics of hawkers with special reference to relocation in the urban setting of Hong Kong. And the hawking situation in the New Territories of Hong Kong is quite different from that of the urban areas which needs a separate study. Besides, to extend our sample to the New Territories would also add substantially to the cost of extensive travelling both in time and in money.

The Sampling Procedure

A description of the sample design helps one to understand whether the sample adopted is representative of the universe as defined above. We outline below the method by which the hawker survey sample was drawn, since it may be of interest to others carrying out research involving large samples in other developing cities.

Our sample design was a one-stage cluster sampling.⁷ A sample of individual hawking units would be difficult to select because a list of all operative hawking units does not exist and would be too costly to prepare. The sample of hawkers was then drawn from the hawker counting carried out in May and June, 1971.⁸ A total of 25992 day-time operative hawking units were included in the universe and hence given a chance of being sampled (Tables 1 and 2).

It was intended that not more than 5% of the operative hawking units in the 1971 hawker counting would be taken as sample. The size of our sample was 1300. This number was considered not too costly in terms of the survey budget.

Our next problem was to direct the interviewers where to go. During the 1971 hawker counting, a list of the number of operative hawking units in each Census Chief Enumerator Unit (C.E.U.)⁹ had been prepared. So the C.E.U. would be our sampling units. That is to say, all hawking units within a C.E.U. taken into the sample would be interviewed. In other words, the operative hawking units located within the boundaries of the sample blocks comprise the sample. The

probability of selection for any hawking units in Hong Kong is the probability of selection of its block. Since the number of hawking units in each C.E.U. varies, the actual sample size depends on the location of the block which happens to be selected. However, the sampling units are C.E.U., selected from a complete list: i.e. the hawker counting, 1971. We took our sample from twenty-four C.E.U. (i.e. approximately 5% of 500 C.E.U.s. were included in our sample) chosen at random.

We use the C.E.U. as sampling units because we can compare and correlate data obtained in the survey with information from the Census. Also, it will avoid a wide dispersion of interviewers which would make supervision difficult. Finally, this restriction of the geographical area will save extensive travelling expense too. The details of the design are summarized in Table 2.

Sampling error, under the sampling design adopted, is calculable, but our belief is that in a study of this kind, non-sampling errors are a greater source of worry than sampling errors. The remedy lies partly in judicious selection and framing of questions, partly in good public relations, and partly in clear definitions and rigorous drilling and supervision of interviews. All these are not to minimise the importance of sampling error. However, the experience gained in the fieldwork of this survey would undoubtedly provide findings of both theoretical and methodological interest, especially for those conducting research on relatively mobile population in the context of South-East Asian countries.

As for the result, although 1274 operative hawking units were selected only 1084 interviews were completed, a proportion of 85.1%. There are two reasons for this response rate. The first and most important is that many hawkers consistently confuse student interviewers with Government employees. They are unwilling to be interviewed because they feel it may be related to a government hawker clearance operation or relocation programme.¹⁰ When they are disabused of this idea they are occasionally resentful and refuse further co-operation. The second reason is that the original hawkers-counting was carried out in May and June, 1971; while this survey was carried out in June, 1972, a time-gap of 12 months. During this period, the social and geographical mobility might be an influential factor contributing to the discrepancy between the number of operative hawking units counted in 1971 and the number counted immediately before this survey was carried out.¹¹ Further, within a C.E.U. no replacements can be obtained for this kind of sample design. Thus, we can hardly expect to have a very high proportion of successful interviews completed. Generally speaking, for a sample survey of hawkers, a relatively mobile population, and without legal backing, the response rate (85.1%) we obtained is indeed satisfactory.

Method of Data Collection

In order to meet the survey's objectives, it was decided to collect data by structured personal interviews with the hawker selected. It was estimated that among our sampling respondents, few would have the patience or motivation or even the ability to write as fully as they might speak.¹² Therefore only structured personal interviews would be used because many hawkers are willing and able to co-operate in a survey when all they have to do is to talk.

All the interviews were conducted by a team of 20 student field-workers, and supervised by the project investigator.

An interview schedule was prepared to obtain information on hawkers and their activities. The form of interview schedule was decided upon after conducting a pilot study in May, 1972.

In order to standardize the question asked by the interviewers, the interview schedule was written in Cantonese dialect, for most of the Chinese population in Hong Kong can speak fluent Cantonese.¹³ Experience has shown that the best chances of securing a favourable response are to pair off respondents and interviewers on the basis of linguistic identity.

During the field operation, each interview was completed within 20 minutes. We considered this amount of time for interview as quite appropriate to the hawkers because all the interviews were carried out by the side of the hawker stalls where the hawking business was usually in progress. During field work, the hawkers were quite willing to co-operate with this kind of short interviews.¹⁴

PRELIMINARY RESULTS

Explanatory Note

- I. As mentioned in the beginning, this work is only a preliminary compilation of the data collected. No detail and theoretical analysis is included.
- II. The present data book is subdivided into two sections.
- (1) The process of data collection as depicted in the previous passages.
 - (2) A set of statistical tables of hawker characteristics cross-tabulated against their locations of business by City District areas.

A word of justification must be said about the second section: cross-tabulating hawkers' characteristics against their location of business by City Districts Areas. The City District Office Scheme which have been established since 1968 have become increasingly an administrative arm of the government at the local level. And the spatial confine of various urban services administration is increasingly falling within the official administrative boundary of the City District Office. Actually, the administrative boundaries of the ten Police Stations in the urban area and the ten Hawker Liaison Offices are the same as those of the City District Offices. Towards the end of 1968, at the request of the Urban Council the Secretary for Home Affairs had set up ten District Hawker Consultative Committees under the chairmanship of the City District Officers. These Committees act as a forum in which people concerned with

hawker matters in a particular district can meet to discuss them, and also advise and co-operate with the Urban Services Department in the implementation of hawker policy. Moreover, it is increasingly obvious that hawking and hawkers, to a large extent, is perceived and treated primarily as one of the management problems in the metropolitan Hong Kong. So, it is worthwhile to classify the hawkers' socio-economic characteristics along this attribute of hawkers' locational difference of business site by City District Areas. Then, these preliminary results, despite its premature form, may be useful perhaps to people and especially those who concern themselves in hawking or hawkers and their management in their own City District Area.

However, it is unfortunate indeed that owing to the weakness, despite its merits in other important aspects, of the one-stage cluster sampling method: i.e. using Census Chief Enumerator Unit (C.E.U.) as our sampling units and to choose randomly 24 C.E.U. (i.e. approximately 5% of 500 C.E.U. were included in our sample) as our intermediate sampling units (see sampling procedure in p.7 - p.9), it happened to be that the sample we drawn by this sampling method did not include any hawking unit at all in the Wong Tai Sin City District Area. In the end, we got data only from hawkers in 9 City District Areas. Nevertheless, having included sampling units from 9 City District Areas out of 10 City District Areas is already a quite satisfactory distribution, and, it is clear that no "ideal" sampling method can serve all ends at the same time with the same effectiveness.

10. Prior to the commencement of the survey, a letter was distributed to each operative hawking unit in the sampled C.E.U. to inform the hawkers when an interview would call. This survey had no legal backing, therefore we had to sent these letters to gain the support and co-operation of the respondents. Two more advantage were gained from this letter distribution. The first is that because all the letters were sent by interviewers to each operative hawking units of every sampling C.E.U. thus, all field-workers could gain some actual fieldwork experience with this kind of initial contact. Secondly, with such kind of preliminary visit, we can ascertain the number of operative hawking units contained in each C.E.U. This will help us to up-date the counting carried out in 1971.
11. 4% of the respondents claimed that they have been doing business at the stall for less than 1 year. Also 2.8% of the respondents mentioned that they have been working as a hawker for less than a year. The two percentages are small, however, geographical and job mobility did exist among all the hawking population during the period of 12 months.
12. In McGee's study, 39.7% of the hawkers interviewed received no

formal education. In this survey, we found out that 43.8% of the sampled hawkers received no formal education.

13. As was expected, the survey result shows that over 90% of the interviews were conducted in Cantonese. In addition, we also found out that 81% of the respondents use Cantonese dialect at home.
14. Our findings shows that only 8% of the sampled hawkers were in the low-cooperation group.
