Fact Sheet for Admission Applications for MPhil / PhD in Chinese Studies
2022/23 Admission

The MPhil and PhD in Chinese Studies Programmes welcome applicants interested in advanced research training in the interdisciplinary study of Chinese history, economy, politics and business, literature, film, religion, culture and society. The programmes are examined in English and are pursued in a multilingual Chinese community at a university uniquely committed since its establishment to the study of Chinese culture in an environment of academic freedom.

The MPhil and PhD programmes offer students:

- A devoted group of faculty advisers, encompassing one of the largest, most diverse collection of China scholars in the world
- A university library system offering the best resources for Chinese scholarship in the world
- A world-class Chinese art collection housed on campus
- Proximity to major libraries, archives, and sites for field research in greater China
- Generous graduate fellowships

Both programmes have successfully placed more than 90% of graduates within a year of receiving their degree. MPhil graduates have been admitted to PhD programmes at Harvard University, Princeton University, Oxford University, Johns Hopkins University, University of Hawaii at Manoa, University of Wisconsin at Madison, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, École Pratique des Hautes Études-Paris, University of Hamburg, Aarhus University, and the Chinese University of Hong Kong. PhD graduates have received post-doctoral fellowships from Columbia University, the University of Pennsylvania, Georgetown University, University of Victoria, Academia Sinica, NYU-Shanghai and teaching positions at the Chinese University of Hong Kong, City University of Hong Kong, the Education University of Hong Kong, Hong Kong Shue Yan University, CUHK-Shenzhen, Fujian Normal University, Nanjing University of Science & Technology, Nanjing Polytechnic University, Shenzhen University, National University of Singapore, New York University-Shanghai, and Langara College-Vancouver.

Programme Information	<p>The MPhil student is required to complete a minimum of 18 units of courses, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two required courses (a total of 6 units). • Two elective seminars or courses offered by related programmes and departments (a total of 6 units). • A Thesis Guidance course every term from the beginning of the second year of study until the Master's thesis is finally submitted (a total of 6 units). <p>Students are required to complete an MPhil thesis and to pass an oral defense of the thesis.</p> <p>English should be used in both the thesis and the oral defense.</p>	<p>The PhD student is required to complete a minimum of 27 units of courses, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two required courses (a total of 6 units). • Three elective seminars or courses offered by related programmes and departments (a total of 9 units). • A Thesis Guidance course every term from the beginning of the second year of study (for students admitted with a research master's degree) or the third year of study (for students admitted without a research master's degree) until the doctoral thesis is finally submitted (a total of 12 units). <p>Students must pass the qualifying examination. Students are required to complete a PhD thesis, which should make substantial contribution to scholarship in the chosen field of specialization, and to pass an oral defense of the thesis.</p> <p>English should be used in both the thesis and the oral defense.</p>

Financial Support and Funding	<p><i>(Applicable to both MPhil and PhD students)</i></p> <p><u>Postgraduate Studentships</u> Postgraduate Studentships (PGS) is available to full-time research postgraduate students and will be made known to them at the time of admission. Students awarded PGS will receive stipends in return for assisting in the teaching and research work of the Centre. The monthly stipend for the academic year 2021-22 is HK\$18,025 for MPhil and PhD (pre-candidacy), or HK\$18,525 for PhD (post-candidacy).</p> <p><u>Tuition Waiver for Local Students</u> The Hong Kong Government grants a tuition waiver to all current and newly admitted local full-time research postgraduate (RPg) students enrolled in UGC-funded RPg programmes for their entire normative period of study. 		<p><i>(Only applicable to PhD students)</i></p> <p><u>Hong Kong PhD Fellowship Scheme (HKPFS)</u> The Hong Kong PhD Fellowship Scheme (HKPFS), established by the Research Grants Council (RGC) of Hong Kong, aims to attract the best and brightest students from across the globe to pursue their PhD studies in Hong Kong universities. It provides a monthly stipend of HK\$26,900 and a conference travel allowance of HK\$13,500 per year during the normative study period for up to three years. They will receive the CUHK Vice-Chancellor's PhD Scholarship of HK\$80,000 subject to satisfactory study progress.</p>

<p>Entry Requirements</p>	<p>In addition to the <u>general requirements</u> of the Graduate School, applicants for MPhil programme must have completed the following in order to qualify for admission:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Graduated from a recognized university and obtained a Bachelor's degree in an area related to Chinese Studies, normally with honours not lower than Second Class; or • Graduated from an honours programme of a recognized university with a Bachelor's degree in an area related to Chinese Studies, normally achieving an average grade of not lower than "B" (80 out of 100); or • Completed a course of study in a tertiary educational institution, and obtained professional or similar qualifications equivalent to an honours degree. 	<p>In addition to the <u>general requirements</u> of the Graduate School, applicants for PhD programme must have completed the following in order to qualify for admission:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Graduated from a recognized university and obtained a Master's degree in an area related to Chinese Studies; or • Have a Bachelor's degree - normally with Second Class Honours in the upper division or above - and have been registered in a course of study for a Master's degree at this University for at least one year and have demonstrated research ability;
