ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

General Admission Requirements

- Graduated from a recognized university and obtained a bachelor's degree, normally with honours not lower than Second Class; or
- Graduated from an honours programme of a recognized university with a bachelor's degree, normally achieving an average grade of not lower than "B"; or
- Completed a course of study in a tertiary educational institution and obtained professional or similar qualification equivalent to an honours degree.

English Language Requirements

- Obtained a degree from a university in Hong Kong or taken a degree programme of which the medium of instruction was English; or
- Achieved scores in the following English Language tests as indicated:
 - TOEFL: 550 (Paper-based) / 79 (Internet-based)
 - IELTS (Academic): 6.5
 - GMAT: Band 21 (Verbal)

ADMISSION SCHOLARSHIPS

To encourage and assist students of strong academic standing to study the Master of Arts in Chinese Studies, the Programme will award a small number of scholarships each academic year.

The value of each scholarship will be equal to 50% of the tuition fee of the given academic year, and the scholarship is awarded based on academic merit and taking into consideration the programme's goal of having a diverse student body.

OUR CURRICULUM

The programme offers two streams:

- Chinese Arts and Culture Stream**, focusing on film, literature and art history
- Issues in Contemporary China Stream**, focusing on politics, society and international relations

Students are required to complete one required course (3 units) and seven elective courses (21 units) within one year in full-time mode. Of the seven elective courses, at least four courses should be within the student's selected stream as prescribed in the course list.
