AIMS

- Provide a basic concept on human gut microbiome and its impact on maternal and infant metabolism and overall health
- Update knowledge on food factors
- Revisit, reflect skills in supporting women with lactating problems
- Update knowledge in identifying infants with nutrition problems relating to feeding, birth defects and inborn error metabolism

INTENDED LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Describe the composition of human microbiome
- Understand the effect of antibiotics, probiotics and prebiotics on the developing infant gut microbiota
- Design a meal plan for pregnant and lactating women
- Differentiate breast pain, plugging and mastitis and give relevant support to women by both physical means and psychological coping strategies
- Advise mother the nutritional concerns to both normal infants and those with problems of birth defects and inborn error metabolism
- Identify types of tongue tie and describe the management and supporting strategies to lactating mothers

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This 40-hour programme is designed for nurses and midwives who care preconceptual, pregnant, postpartum and breastfeeding women, newborns and infants during their first 1000 days of life. The course is divided into four parts that each focus on different core concepts relating to maternal and infant health

- PART 1 Overview of human gut microbiome and how it composites and affect human beings
- PART 2 Advise an appropriate meal plan to pregnant and lactating women through informed knowledge of different food factors
- PART 3 Review on supporting skills to women undergoing breast surgery. Discuss coping strategies and bioethics concerns for women with lactating problems
- PART 4 Identify infants with growth and survival threats related to nutrition and inborn error metabolism. Introduction of tongue-tied assessment, diagnosis and management in newborns. Address specific lactation skills in supporting these dyads

ENTRY REQUIRMENT

Applicants should possess a BSc degree or relevant diploma

TARGET PARTICIPANTS

Midwives or nurses, who are caring pregnant women and infants in both out-patient and in-patient settings

COURSE DESIGN

The course is delivered through lectures and interactive case discussion with 40 teaching hours for the whole course
