For Science Students only

- Different from University-wide (U-Wide) exchange programmes
- Science Student Exchange Programme (SSEP) is tailored for science students
- 2 types of SSEP:
 - Science Programme
 - Science and Engineering Programme
- Invaluable opportunities for making connections for research, internship, mentorship, etc.

- Improve career prospects










Summer Exchange Programme (SEP)

- Ideal for students who cannot participate in exchange during term-time due to curriculum requirements and structure
- <u>credit-bearing courses</u> and <u>social and cultural</u> <u>activities</u> organized by the summer programme of the host institution
- Duration: June August, (4 6 weeks)





Summer Exchange Programme (SEP)

- Fees: Only pay programme and accommodation fees to the host institution; tuition fee and application fees will be waived
- Application: use the *same* outgoing exchange application as the term-time exchange programmes (make the intended SEP one of your ten choices in the application)
- Participating host institutions to be announced on OAL website



Credit Transfer

- Academic credits earned during your studies abroad may be transferred back to CUHK
- Requests evaluated on a case-by-case basis
- students need to consult with your exchange advisor in your programme/department/school <u>before</u> you go abroad
 - Preliminary Assessment on Course and Unit Exemption
 - (PACU form)



Will it be expensive?

Typically, you would pay:

- CUHK tuition (not applicable for summer programme)
- CUHK and College SU Fees (not applicable for summer programme)
- Accommodation (CUHK or host university / country)
- Health and Travel Insurance
- Meal Plan
- Student Visa
- Airfare
- Other costs......





Will it be expensive?

- Other costs......
 - Books and stationery
 - Personal expenses
 - Cultural activities
 - Transportation (local and inter-state)
 - Warm clothing for some exchange destinations
