Chinese University Student Information System (CUSIS)

To cater for the needs of various stakeholders including students, staff and alumni arising from new requirements of the 334 education reform, the Chinese University Student Information System (CUSIS) was developed to bring disparate information and data together, help link up the related processes so as to improve services to the University community, and produce quality management information more effectively.

Through CUSIS, students can manage personal and academic information online, while teaching staff can have access to and manage various teaching and learning information on one single platform. Apart from serving as a centralized database and providing integrated workflows, CUSIS also performs other functions such as online student registration (Figure 1), course enrolment (Figure 2), academic planning (Figure 3), management of personal particulars, online payments and application for credit transfer (Figure 4), hence effectively facilitate students' university life experience from admission to graduation, and extends further beyond.

Students can also browse programme information (Figures 5 & 6) and course information (Figures 7 & 8) through CUSIS. These include study scheme, programme learning outcomes, course details, enrolment information, course outcomes and class information.

Through CUSIS, staff can link up the updated processes to improve various services to the University community, and produce quality management information more effectively so as to support timely decision making and execution of actions. Examples of CUSIS functions for staff include viewing students' information of classes, managing class rosters (Figure 9), viewing class grade distribution report for grading management, as well as end-of-term and graduation assessment processes.

The implementation of CUSIS has also facilitated CUHK alumni to access their own MyCUHK alumni accounts. Student information stored in CUSIS will be transferred to alumni database upon graduation, thus enabling numerous alumni services, such as updating personal contacts and applying for alumni library card, which is available by using MyCUHK alumni accounts (Figure 10).

Description
In the latter half of the 20th century, working in the media and communication industries referred mainly to working for newspapers, broadcasting stations, film companies, and advertising or PR industries. But with the advance of digital media technologies, old boundaries among the distinctive media sectors are seemingly blurring or even falling apart, while there might also be new types of "media companies." This course is designed to familiarize students with the evolving realities of the various media industries in Hong Kong, China, and beyond. The overarching questions to be discussed in the class include: How can one characterize the configuration of the contemporary media industries? What are the key trends underlying the transformation of the media industries? What are the implications of these transformations for "media workers"? What does it mean by working as a journalist, a creative content producer, an advertiser, etc. in the contemporary world and in the future? What are the communication practices involved in the various industries? What are the broader social, cultural, and political implications of the transformation of media work and media industries?
