The 'uBuddies' Network was launched by the Student Counselling and Development Service of the Office of Student Affairs in 2010 as part of the 'Caring Campus' Campaign. A third cohort of peer counsellors, uBuddies 2012, will be recruited to assist in the continuous promotion of a caring and supportive campus culture in CUHK. Details are as follows:

Training:

- 4 sessions totalling 12 hours on peer counselling skills
- Overnight adventure training camp to build team spirit and to enhance self-understanding and self-confidence
- 4 sessions totalling 14 hours on Youth Mental Health First Aid Standard Course
- Practicum supervision
- Service projects

Attainable Qualifications:

- CUHK uBuddies Certificate
- Certificate of Youth Mental Health First Aid Standard Course (certificate is jointly issued by The Mental Health Association of Hong Kong and acknowledged by the ORYGEN Research Centre of the Department of Psychiatry, The University of Melbourne)
