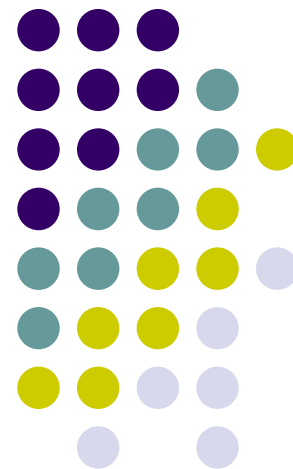

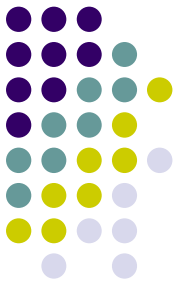
CUHK's educational target

- It is the goal of the University that both formal curriculum and non-formal education contribute to the overall quality of our students and graduates.

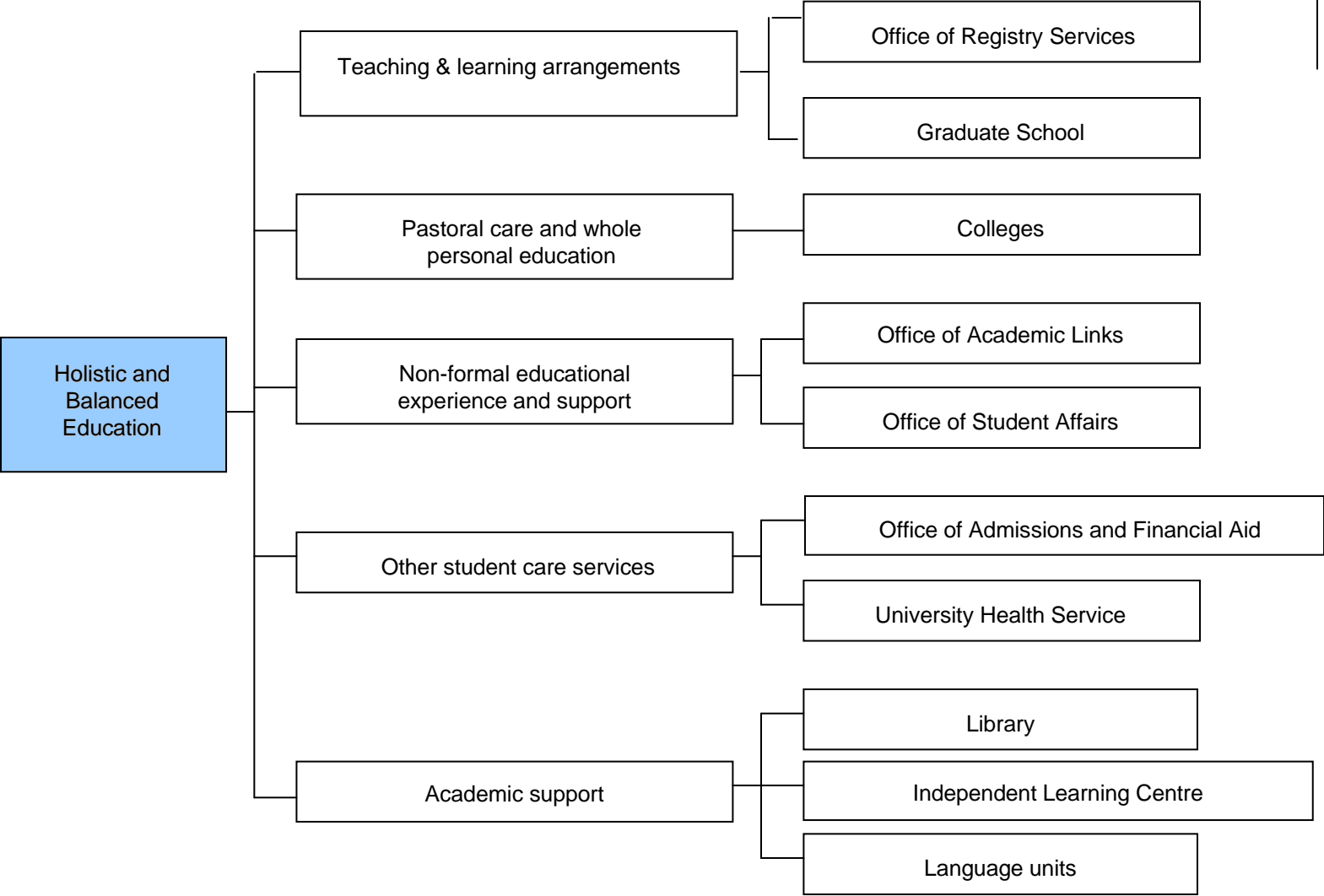


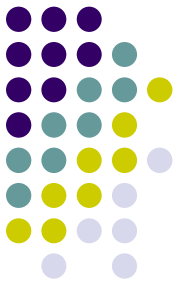
Expected graduate outcomes

A System of Support for Students



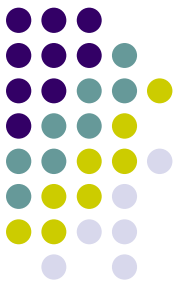


Office of Student Affairs

1. Student Activities and Amenities Section

- Coordinating student activities and developmental programmes
- Managing student amenities in Staff-Student Centres and the Swimming Pool
- Liaison with and providing guidance to student bodies
- Enhancing communication between the University and students

2. Incoming Students Section

- Providing guidance and support to non-local students
- Learning enhancement service
- Managing the International House and providing other accommodation-related support
- Organizing cultural diversity programmes

3. Student Counselling and Development Service

- Providing psychological counselling services to students -
Adjustment, studies, interpersonal, psychosocial problems
- Organizing self-enhancement programmes for students
- Promoting mental health education and positive psychology
- Offering training for student affairs colleagues in other units

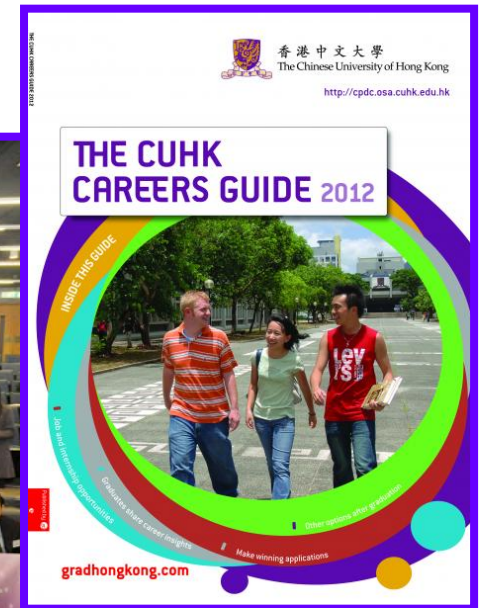




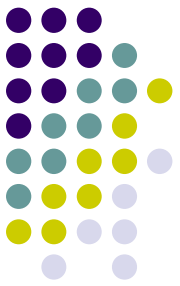

College Support

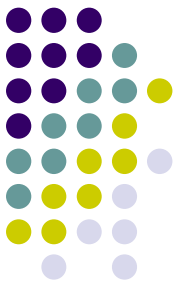


- Second Fulton Report (1976):
 - Disciplinary teaching → academic faculties/departments
 - Whole-person education → Colleges

Each CUHK undergraduate student belongs to one of the Colleges, and students benefit from the pastoral care and whole-person education offered by these Colleges.

- The Dean of Students' Office :
 - offers guidance and advice to students
 - administers college scholarships and bursary awards
 - manages student hostels

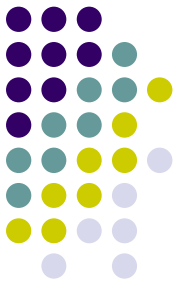




Office of Academic Links (OAL)

- Coordinates incoming and outgoing student exchange programmes
- Promotion of student exchange programmes commences in early October and applications are due in late October each year for exchanges in the following year





Office of Admissions and Financial Aid (OAFA)

- Offers scholarships, prizes and academic awards
- Provides different types of bursaries and loans to help eligible students who are in financial need
- Assists in the administration of various financial assistance schemes offered by the Student Financial Assistance Agency of the Hong Kong SAR Government





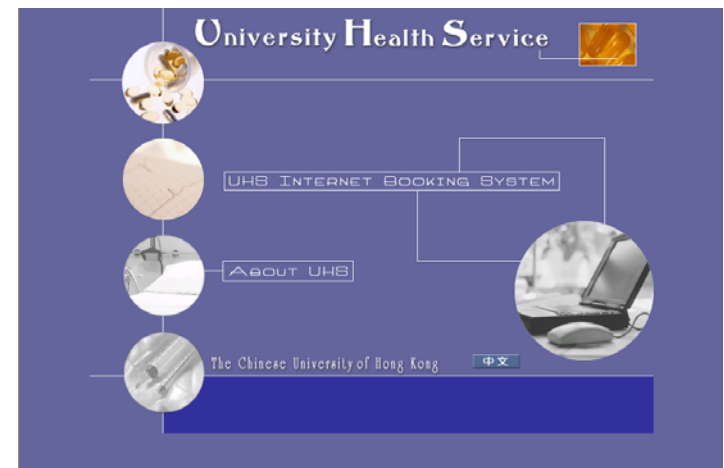
University Health Service

- Organize health promotion services for students

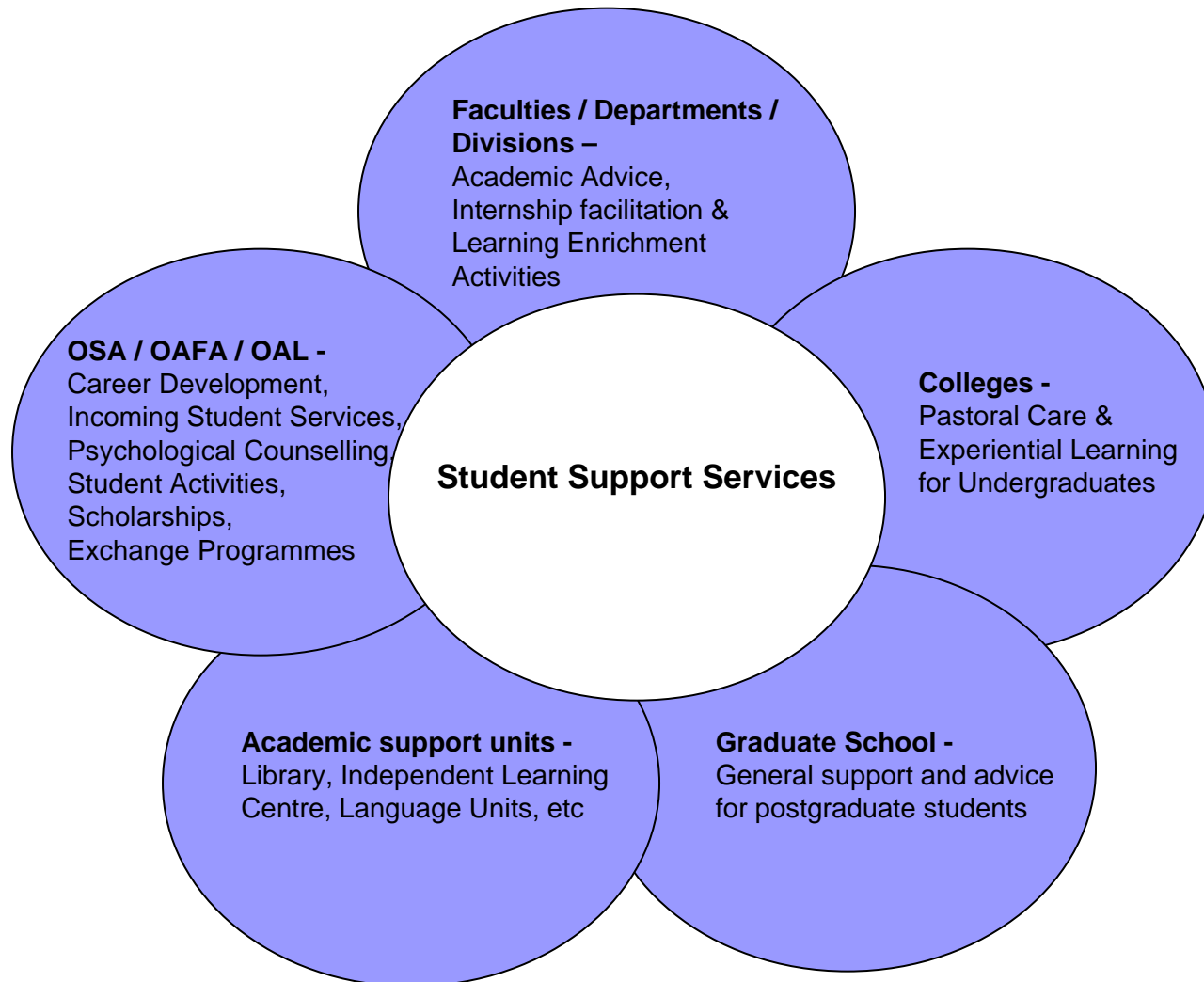
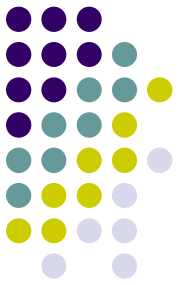
