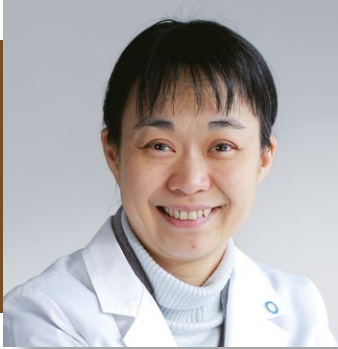

I am glad that my journey embarked here. I will ensure that this is just the beginning, and I will continue to dedicate myself to biomedical research.

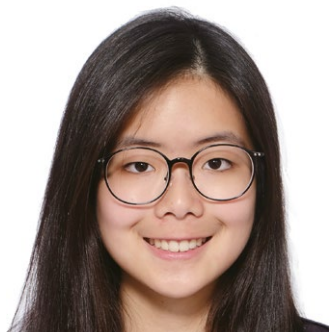

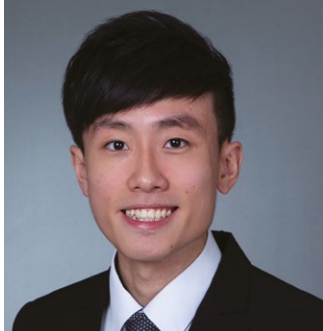
