

GLOBAL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME FOR RESEARCH EXCELLENCE FOR 2019–20

Guidelines for Applicants (Visiting PhD Students)

Deadline: 3 April 2019, Wednesday

The Global Scholarship Programme for Research Excellence was launched in 2007 with a generous funding provided by CNOOC. The programme aims to enhance research excellence at the Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK) through building and strengthening the University's ties with leading research universities and institutes around the world and to increase the visibility of CUHK as a world-class research university through student mobility. It allows students to enrich their learning experience and facilitates research collaborations between faculty members at CUHK and their international counterparts.

The programme provides accommodation support to PhD students from one of the following institutions to undertake short-term research visits at CUHK. These institutions include the member institutions of the Worldwide Universities Network (WUN)* to which CUHK belongs.

Eligibility

- a) Applicants must be registered full-time PhD students at one of the above institutions at the time of application and during the research visit.
- b) The research visit shall last for a minimum of one month and a maximum of six months. It shall be carried out and completed between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020, and prior to the submission of final thesis.
- c) Applicants must present a clear proposal for high impact research under the supervision of a host at CUHK.
- d) For applications from WUN member institutions, special considerations will be given to research

that falls within one of the four WUN Global Challenges, i.e. Global Higher Education and Research; Public Health (Non-communicable Disease); Responding to Climate Change; and Understanding Cultures. - e) The applications must be endorsed by the relevant heads of departments/units to confirm that on-going collaboration in the proposed research area will be supported.
- f) Past award holders of the Global Scholarship Programme for Research Excellence and PhD Student Exchange Programme will be accorded lower priority in the assessment. Those who have been awarded twice are not eligible to apply.

Other factors which may be taken into consideration include:

- g) Academic performance of the applicants.
- h) Output from previous joint activities/exchange activities with CUHK/host supervisor.

Terms of Award

- Award holders will receive free on-campus housing at CUHK during the visit on a shared room basis. (The housing will be extended to the award holders only and will not be extended to any accompanying partner and/or dependent of the award holders).
- b) Award holders will be responsible for arranging the practicalities of their visit, including but not limited to traveling plans, visa application, health and medical insurance, and travel insurance¹. Applicants are reminded to learn more about the costs required for the visit during the planning stage.

Application Procedures

Applicants should complete an <u>online application form</u> and submit supporting documents by **3 April 2019**, **Wednesday**:

The following documents should be submitted online:

- a) Supporting letter from the home thesis supervisor.
- b) All transcripts of academic report of postgraduate studies at the home institution.
- c) Applicant's Curriculum Vitae.
- d) Copy of notification of financial support for the proposed visit to CUHK, if any.

The application should be supported by the CUHK supervisor and head of host department. The recommendation and endorsement form (download <u>here</u>) should be completed and returned by email (c/o Ms. Olivia Kwok – Global Scholarship Programme; <u>mobilityscheme@cuhk.edu.hk</u>) in pdf format.

Incomplete application will NOT be considered.

Selection Procedures

- a) Only one award will be made to each applicant. Applicants will be notified of the results by July 2019.
- b) Selection for the Global Scholarship Programme for Research Excellence will be made by the Selection Committee for Faculty and Postgraduate Student Mobility Schemes, which reserves final authority over the selection of candidates taking into account recommendations from the applicants' home supervisors, host supervisors at CUHK, and the availability of funds. The decision of the Selection Committee is final and not open to appeal. Documents submitted will not be returned. Applicants not selected may respond to future calls for application provided that the application requirements are met.

Visa and Housing Arrangement

- Award holders will be registered as an associate student at CUHK and will be required to apply for a student visa for the visit on their own expense (there is <u>no exception</u> unless the award holder is a Hong Kong citizen). OAL will provide assistance in visa application.
- b) Award holders will receive free on-campus housing during their visit on a shared room basis. Housing

will be provided based on availability. Cancellation policies apply and the cost will be borne by the award holders.

c) Award holders should notify OAL as soon as the visit dates are finalised in order to secure a booking. In the event that on-campus housing is not available, the Selection Committee reserves the right to request the award holders to amend their visit period. Should the award holders choose not to stay at the assigned housing, they will be required to make their own arrangements and the costs will not be covered by the Global Scholarship Programme for Research Excellence.

Change of Visit Period

Award holders may request to amend their visit period or duration after the award is made. The request should be made in writing. The amended period or duration must comply with the condition stated in the Eligibility section. The request will be subject to endorsement by the Selection Committee.

Post-Visit Report

Award holders are required to submit a post-visit report within 30 days upon completion of the visit. The report should be endorsed by the host supervisor at CUHK and the home thesis supervisor. To download the "Post-visit Report Form", please click <u>here</u>.

Should an award holder fail to perform satisfactorily during the visit, the Selection Committee reserves the right to adjust or demand a refund of the award.
