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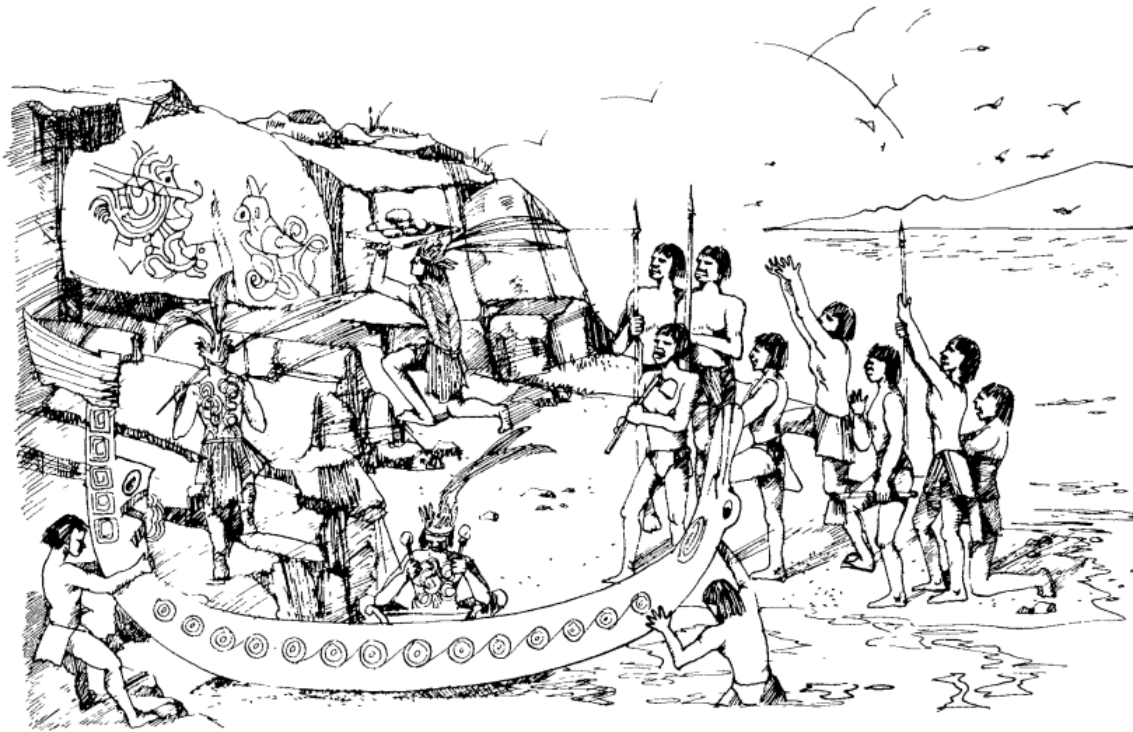

Course description:

Contrary to the politically-motivated myth of “a barren rock” as portrayed by the British in the 19th century, Hong Kong has a rich archaeological heritage spanning at least 6000 years of human history, which is also essential for understanding the cultural relicts in the Greater Bay Area in a wider context. Who were the earliest inhabitants, where were they from, and what brought them to Hong Kong and other areas in the Pearl River Delta, one of the remotest corners of East Asia continent? This course introduces major archaeological discoveries in Hong Kong dating from the Neolithic to the Song Dynasty and reviews the daily lives and social structures of Hong Kong’s ancient inhabitants

This course will also compare and contrast evidence for prehistoric and historical cultural developments in Hong Kong with those occurring in the Pearl River Delta and the wider South China region. The significance of Hong Kong archaeology in the contexts of prehistoric and historical South China and Southeast Asia will also be evaluated. In addition, there will be an exploration of the tensions and

potentials existing in Hong Kong between its development-driven economy and rich archaeological resources, as played out in the field of impact assessment archaeology.

Topics of this course include:

- A bridge between two landmasses – the significance of Hong Kong archaeology.
- The early inhabitants of Hong Kong
- Peoples and their way of life in Hong Kong from the Bronze age through the historical period.
- Cultural dynamics between Hong Kong, Pearl River Delta (the Great Bay area), and Southeast Asia.

Learning outcomes:

After taking this course, students should:

- understand the trajectory of pre/historical cultural development in Hong Kong and have a good grasp of the key changes through time and their associated research issues;
- have a critical awareness of debates surrounding cultural exchanges and human diaspora between Hong Kong and adjacent areas.
- fully understand how material remains and associated archaeological data have been used to reconstruct past socio-economic lifeways in Hong Kong;
- have enhanced their capacity for multi-disciplinary, critical, and independent thinking;
