

 - → Four areas: common concerns in contemporary and/or specific issues and making connection






- 3. promote an understanding of Chinese cultural heritage and of other cultural traditions;
 - → Area A Chinese cultural heritage
 - → Four areas: other cultural traditions (particularly Area C)
 - → College GE: formal courses, exchange programmes, hostel life






- 4. develop in students attitudes and skills that are conducive to critical thinking, self-expression and communication with the others;
 - → All GE courses
 - → Class discussion, written assignments or other creative projects
 - → In-class presentation when appropriate





- 5. serve as a platform where students can extend their curiosity, read widely beyond their chosen discipline, and develop attitudes and competence as independent learners and also as team players.
 - → All GE courses
 - → Appropriate reading assignment
 - → Teamwork when appropriate, CGE senior seminar
 - → Nurturing of attitudes and emphasis on study skills

- Review cycle: every three years
- Other courses to be reviewed:
 - 1. Courses offered for the 1st time
 - 2. Repeated review: after implementation of revisions recommended by SCGESC
 - 3. Courses with reported potential issues



Criteria

- Alignment with UGE objectives and area intended learning outcomes
- Implementation quality
 - Adherence to original design
 - Learning activities: quality of instruction
 - Alignment of course assessment
- Student performance



Purposes

- 1. to provide evidence for internal course review;
- 2. to promote a practice of giving clear information and guidelines to students;
- 3. to facilitate accumulation and sharing of experiences;
- 4. to pool information for research and betterment of GE programme.



Materials to be collected for courses to be reviewed:

- Course outline
- Final exam question paper (no additional action from teachers needed)
- Question papers/ Guidelines for all assessment components
- Sample answer scripts of a major assessment component
- Teacher survey



- Secretariat and executive arm of the Senate Committee on GE
