





Information and Automation Technology



Research Achievements

The University Grants Committee has provided preferential funding to local tertiary institutions to conduct research in selected Areas of Excellence (AoE). Out of a total of 28 such projects, 11 are led by CUHK researchers.





Eligibility

Candidates who are seeking admission as new full-time PhD students in Hong Kong universities funded by the University Grants Committee (UGC), irrespective of their country of origin, prior work experience and ethnic background, are eligible to apply.

Timeline



Selection Criteria

The HKPFS Selection Panels will select awardees based on the following factors with candidates' academic excellence being most important:



Academic excellence



Research ability and/or potential



Communication and interpersonal skills



Leadership abilities

The Award

 Provides a monthly stipend of HK\$27,100 (~US\$3,475) and a conference travel allowance of HK\$13,600 (~US\$1,740) per year for a maximum period of three years.

Postgraduate Studentship (PGS)

- Available to full-time Research Master's (MPhil) and Research Doctoral (PhD) students within their normative study period.
- Subject to revision by the University from time to time.
- For the academic year 2022-23, the monthly PGS is
 - MPhil/PhD (Pre-candidacy): HK\$18,025 (~US\$2,310)
 - PhD (Post-candidacy): HK\$18,525 (~US\$2,375)
- PGS holders are required to assist the respective Graduate Divisions on certain duties relating to research or teaching.

Other Scholarships & Funding Support

- More scholarships and funding schemes are available for postgraduate students, including:
 - Research Postgraduate Student Grant for Overseas Academic Activities (for all RPgs)
 - Belt and Road Scholarship
 - Global Scholarship Programme for Research Excellence
 - PhD Student Exchange Programme
 - The Reaching Out Award
 - Young Scholars Thesis Award
 - Ernst Mach Grant for PhD Students and Post-Docs
- Some self-financed taught postgraduate programmes also offer scholarships to eligible students.

General Admissions Requirements

For PhD and Taught Doctoral Programmes

• A master's degree from a recognised university

For MPhil-PhD and Master of Philosophy Programmes

- A bachelor's degree from a recognised university, with Second Class honours or above; or
- A bachelor's degree from an honours programme from a recognised university, with an average grade of "B" or above

English Language Requirements for Admission

- A degree from a university in Hong Kong¹ or a degree of which the medium of instruction was English; or
- Achieved scores in the following English Language tests² as indicated:
 - TOEFL: 550 (paper-based)/ 79 (internet-based); or
 - IELTS (Academic): 6.5; or
 - GMAT: Band 21 (Verbal)

Notes:

- 1. This is based on the understanding that English is the medium of instruction of degree programmes offered by universities in Hong Kong.
- 2. TOEFL and IELTS scores are considered valid for two years from the test date. GMAT score is considered valid for five years from the test date.






