Important Notes

(Please read carefully before application.)

1. Exchange Period

- a. Ideally, undergraduate students should go during their third and fourth year of undergraduate study, whom have good academic and disciplinary record and standing at CUHK.
- b. According to the Regulations Governing Full-time Undergraduate Studies (http://rgsntl.rgs.cuhk.edu.hk/aqs-prd-applx/Public/Handbook/Default.aspx?id=1543&tv=T&lang=en), CUHK students who have satisfied all graduation requirements shall graduate (Regulation 12.1). <a href="https://graduation.graduates.graduation.gradua
- c. Students should refer to the CUHK Undergraduate Student Handbook to check the credit unit requirements of their enrolled CUHK undergraduate programme and other requirements for graduation, decide how many course units they plan to enroll in each academic term and apply to go on exchange before earning all credit units required for graduation.
- d. Students who <u>intend to go on exchange after their expected graduation date</u> can only apply and participate in an exchange programme which takes place immediately after their last academic term for taking courses for graduation (excludes summer term) at CUHK.

 Students concerned
 - can only apply for exchange for one academic term (except for students with an **expected** graduation date on 31 December 2022 who are not eligible for any exchange programme in 2023-24), and
 - will be given an **exchange offer (if applicable) only if they have/would <u>not</u> earned all credit units required for graduation (i.e.** have outstanding credit units shown on CUSIS) by the time of placement allocation is done.

2. Maximum Cumulative Period of Exchange

Throughout the study period at CUHK, each student can go on exchange for a maximum of one academic year, i.e. an exchange(s) in two regular academic terms offered by any CUHK unit(s) plus one university-wide summer exchange offered by OAL.

3. Course Load Requirement during Exchange (Undergraduates)

- a. Students must enroll in and pass a required number of courses when they are on exchange.
- b. For undergraduate students, the <u>minimum requirement is nine (9) units and passing at least six</u> (6) of them per term or the equivalent, except for summer exchanges. <u>Failure to do so may cause complications to your graduation and/or 100% repayment of financial support provided through OAL and/or the College.</u>
- c. If you need to <u>transfer credit units earned from the exchange(s) to your studies at CUHK for graduation, you are strongly recommended to seek pre-approval from major and/or relevant CUHK department/programmes on the transferability of credit units from host institution to <u>your studies at CUHK.</u> Final approval for courses and unit exemption will only be given after the official transcript is received from the host institution with an acceptable grade(s) for the course(s) concerned.</u>
- d. For students who plan to go on <u>exchange in their final term</u>, their official transcript issued by the host institution must reach RES directly or via OAL by December for your first-term exchange and by June for your second-term exchange. Otherwise, the graduation assessment and award result may be delayed. Chances are there their transcript may not be issued/delivered to RES/OAL on time.

4. Credit Transfer

Students are advised to approach relevant CUHK academic departments which have full autonomy to determine which credits of courses taken abroad could be transferred to CUHK before finalizing your choice of programmes.

5. Mandatory TOEFL/ IELTS scores

- a. Programmes marked with # in the Exchange Programme Details Table means TOEFL or IELTS scores is mandatory. You have to provide a valid TOEFL or IELTS score (including overall score and sub-scores, if applicable) to the College **on or before 26 January 2023**. Otherwise, you will NOT be considered as an eligible applicant for these programmes.
- b. Your score is <u>valid</u> if your score report is issued for no more than two years when you submit your <u>admission application</u>, meaning scores from tests **taken on or after 1 September 2021** are valid for applications. You are strongly advised to take a TOEFL or IELTS test as early as possible (if necessary). MyBestscores of TOEFL is not accepted for applications.
- c. <u>Some host institutions set the valid period of TOEFL/IELTS scores at 24 months prior to the commencement of exchange period.</u> For students who are nominated for exchange with English-proficiency requirements should make sure their TOEFL/IELTS scores meet the requirements set by the host institution. <u>Students may need to sit for a TOEFL or IELTS test again for meeting host institution</u>'s requirement.
- d. For those who wish to go to <u>United Kingdom</u> to exchange: Students are recommended to sit for IELTS (UKVI Academic) test to fulfill UK (Tier 4) student visa requirement. Further information on the approved test can be referred to the British Council Hong Kong website https://ielts.britishcouncil.org.hk/iorps/html/registration/selectExamTypeServlet.do?vEngine and the UK Visas and Immigration website https://www.gov.uk/tier-4-general-visa. This requirement table will be updated from time to time to reflect relevant change(s) to the individual programme's IELTS requirements.
- e. You should check in advance the English language requirements of the programme you are interested in and decide if you would take TOEFL or IELTS. If you intend to apply to an <u>Australian university</u>, you must meet the English Language Test requirement to get an Australian student visa (https://immi.homeaffairs.gov.au/visas/getting-a-visa/visa-listing/student-500#Eligibility under the "Meet English language requirements" and "English language tests" sections).
- f. You are required to provide their TOEFL/IELTS score report. Your full name, test date and scores must be clearly shown on the report.
- g. For programmes with TOEFL or IELTS requirements but are not marked with #, you will have to provide a valid TOEFL or IELTS score when you submit the application to the host institution. The application period of the host institution varies from February to May for Term 1 and Year exchange, and from May to August for Term 2 exchange.

6. Non-English Language Proficiency

- a. If you would like to select an exchange programme that requires proficiency in other languages, you must indicate in your online application form that you have the level of proficiency at least one level lower than the specified requirement (e.g. if the requirement is German Intermediate, you must indicate that you have the proficiency of elementary German, i.e. have had about 150-200 learning hours or currently enrolled in a Language IV course at CUHK), otherwise, you will not be considered for that particular exchange programme.
- b. By the time you participate in the exchange programme, you should have completed the following number of learning hours for meeting the CEFR* level of requirements:

A2 = at least 200 hours

B1 = at least 300 hours

B2 = at least 500 hours

C1 = at least 700 hours

C2 = at least 1000 hours

If you have any doubt on their current level, you should consult their language teacher. <u>College and OAL</u> will not certify students' language proficiency. **Below is for reference only**.
