

Designing a Service Learning Project Poster

A poster is a **visual** presentation. Limit the use of text; rely heavily on **graphics**. Your poster should tell a story in a **clear**, **orderly**, and **self-explanatory** fashion. Avoid clutter.


<u>Guidelines</u>


- 1. Your audience will include other Morningside students, Fellows, teachers, and visitors to the College.
- 2. Is there an **essential concept, idea, or point** that you would like to get across to the viewer? This should be the **focal point** of your poster. (You may consider including up to 3 points; e.g. Scholarship, Virtue, Service)
- 3. Your poster should fit a 2ft.wide x 2ft tall (60cm wide x 60cm tall) space. Matte poster board (any color) is preferable, but not required.
- 4. Material should be arranged into columns so that viewers can follow the sequence.
- 5. Leave some open space; an open layout is less tiring to the eye.
- 6. Text should be typed, not hand written. [If you are familiar with PowerPoint, you may consider using this program to design your poster.]
- 7. Font(s) should be simple and easy to read (e.g. Times New Roman, Arial). Text should be readable from 20 feet away.
- 8. Title should be in **BOLD CAPS** (\rightarrow 96pt.).
- 9. Poster author names should be listed beneath the title in **Bold Upper/Lowercase** (\rightarrow 72pt.)

- 10. Use color to enhance comprehension, not to decorate.
- 11. Provide a brief introduction (3-5 sentences) in the upper left corner (#1 in figure below).
- 12. Provide your conclusions in the lower right corner (#6).
- 13. The images below are for reference only. Feel free to modify the structure of your poster to fit your project.





Questions to ask yourself before beginning:

- Why did I embark on this service project?
- What was most meaningful about the experience?
- Will I continue to participate in similar service projects in future?
- What do I want others to know about the project?
- How can I/Should I encourage others to get involved?

A poster that answers these questions is a successful poster.
