### Over the Summer

Chung Chi Elizabeth Luce Moore Library saw the renovation of its second floor, designed to be a music library, finally bringing music audio-visual recordings, books, scores and exhibition space for the amazing Rulan Chao Pian collection of traditional Chinese musical instruments together. In the Autumn our major exhibition will focus on our collection from this renowned ethnomusicologist.

Meanwhile in the basement of the University Library to enable students' creativity, innovation and entrepreneurship we have been building MakerSpace. This exciting new space includes a creative media studio, laser cutting facilities, upgraded 3D printing and scanning, and virtual and augmented reality facilities. We can't wait to see what you will make.

## ReadingList – a new way to find your course reading lists

Welcome to [ReadingList](#), a new reading list management system the Library has implemented. After a successful pilot phase, CUHK Library is now rolling out *ReadingList*, which allows Faculty, students and library staff to collaborate in the creation, management and evaluation of recommended learning resources.

*ReadingList* has exclusive features that allows you to add materials from basically any resource – hard copy books, online journals, your own PDFs, and YouTube videos are just a few examples.

### Benefits for Students

Find all of their course readings in one place, recommend resources, and post comments for discussion.

Access resources directly from *LibrarySearch* – no separate log-in credentials needed, no broken links, mobile friendly.

Direct access to articles via the citation link.

### Benefits for Faculty

Easy to use: structured, annotated reading lists that are easy to share and maintain.

Intuitive user interface that could be available on any device.

Analytics and reports provide an overview of the materials students use and their usage patterns.

Save faculty time through workflows for creating, sharing, and maintaining lists year after year.

Automatic identification of resources that the library owns or is already subscribing to.

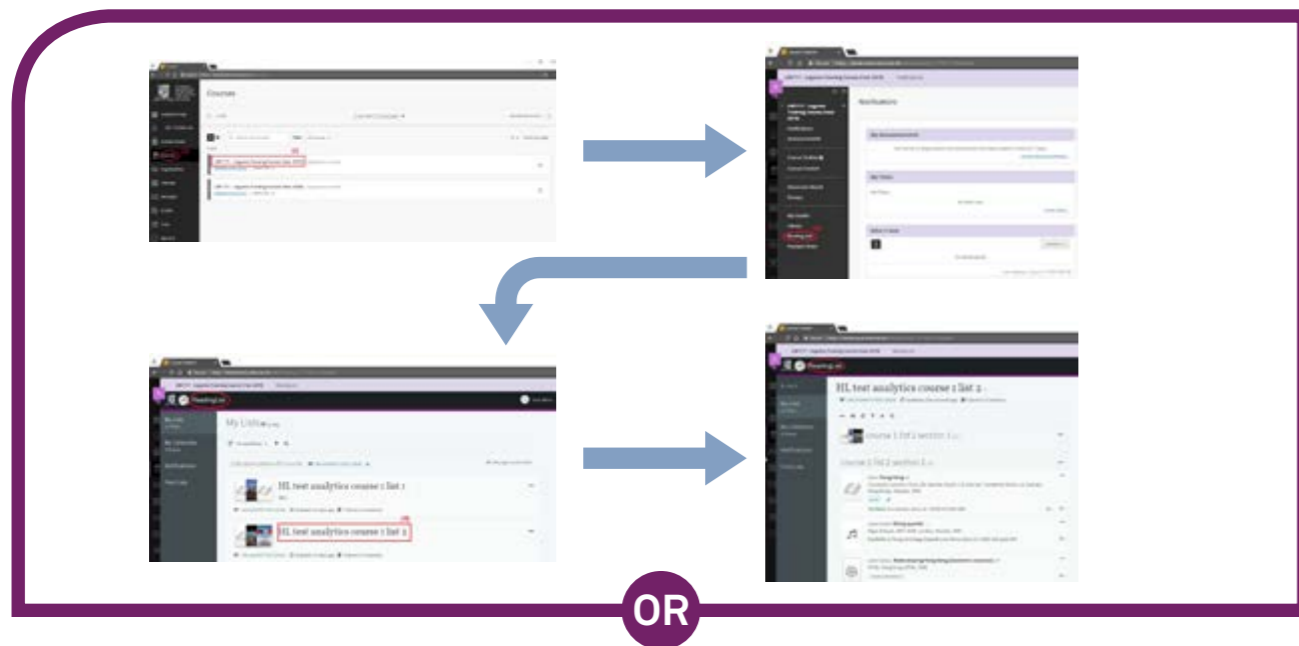

Reading lists that can include all material types, including dynamic linking to full texts.

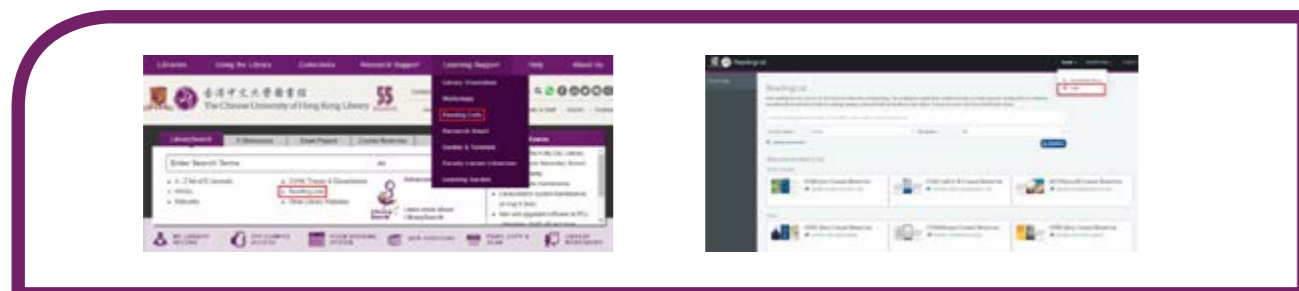

## Getting started in finding a reading list:

- Login **from Blackboard**. If your lecturer has created a reading list for your course: (1) Click on the link “Courses” on the menu bar (2) Select a course (3) Click “Reading List” on the menu bar (4) Select a course and the reading list will display.



- **From the Library Homepage**, click “Reading List” from the pull-down menu



A [library guide](#) has been designed to help you use *ReadingList*. Staff can build, maintain, and share their course reading lists on Blackboard using the *ReadingList* application; librarians can provide resources more efficiently and scale up to support more courses, and more importantly, students can access all course materials in one place. It is easy to search for materials, and share information with students.

## Collection Spotlight

### Rulan Chao Pian Collection

With the support of the Department of Music, the Library is greatly honoured to receive the invaluable “Rulan Chao Pian Collection” donated by an eminent ethnomusicologist Prof. Rulan Chao Pian (卞趙如蘭, 1922–2013), who was Professor of East Asian Languages and Civilizations and of Music at Harvard University from 1974 until her retirement in 1992. In 1978–79 and 1982, she was a visiting professor of the Department of Music of The Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK), where she advised on the establishment of the Chinese Music Archive and the ethnomusicology curriculum with a focus on Chinese music.

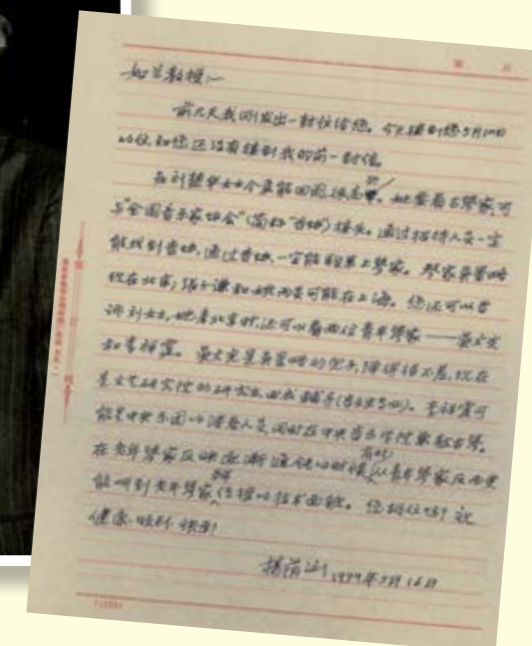
The Collection is the result of a life-time of accumulation, acquisition, and research by Prof. Chao. The wide range of manuscripts including correspondences, diaries, and teaching materials tell of her life, research, teaching, and social

network. The various types of twentieth-century recording materials, such as Betamax, U-Matic, V8, VHS, open reel sound and video tapes, cassettes, CDs, and LPs, demonstrates her pioneering effort in carrying video and audio equipment for doing field work, with focus on East Asian regions. The instruments in the Collection shows her steps in China, Hong Kong, Japan, Korea, and India.

The correspondence and photos of the Collection depict her connections with scholars around the world. As her father was Chao Yuen Ren (趙元任), a renowned linguist and composer, the Collection discloses her family network with Chinese intellectuals and western musicians and scholars in the twentieth century. These materials also suggests her nurture of some significant sinologists at Harvard, including Perry Link (林培瑞).

The Collection provides unique and precious research materials on Chinese music studies. The exchanges between musicologists Yang Yinliu (楊蔭瀏) and Xu Changhui (許常惠) strengthen the atmosphere of Chinese music research in mainland China and Taiwan. Studying the field work recording of Peking drum song singing by Luo Yuzhen (駱玉笙) against Prof. Chao's analytical notes, transcriptions, and relevant articles reveal the creation process of ethnomusicological research on Chinese music and the transmission of Chinese music to the West.

The Collection showcases how East meets West from different perspectives. An exhibition of the Collection entitled *East-West Connection in Music: An Exhibition of the Rulan Chao Pian Collection* will be held in the University Library from 8 October 2019 to 31 January 2020. The Collection is now available at <https://archives.lib.cuhk.edu.hk/repositories/5/resources/372> and its digital repository will be launched in October 2019.

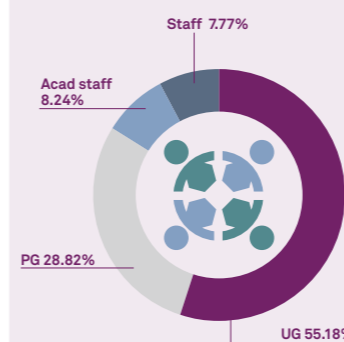

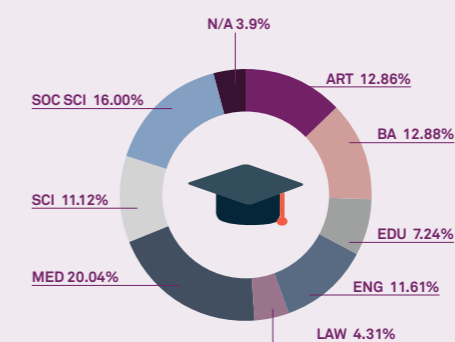

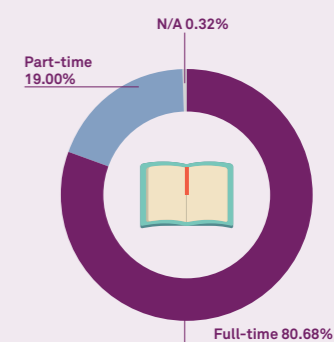

by User Group



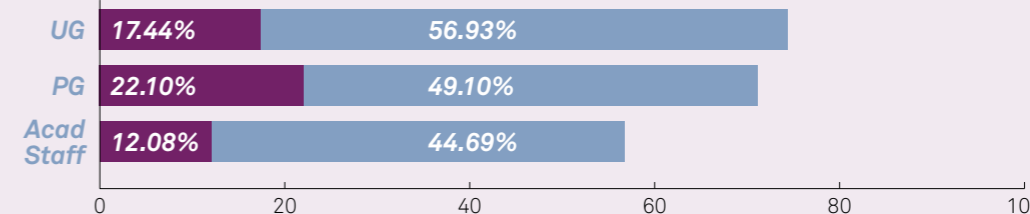
Respondents  
by Faculty



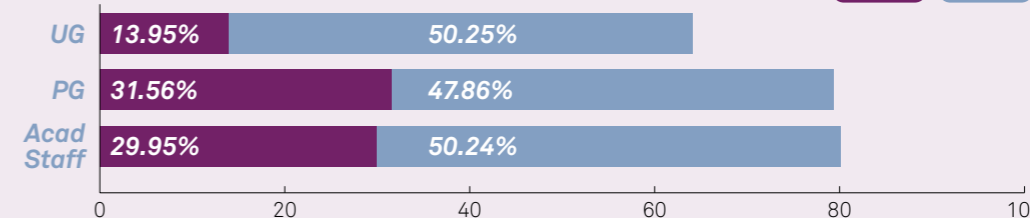
Respondents

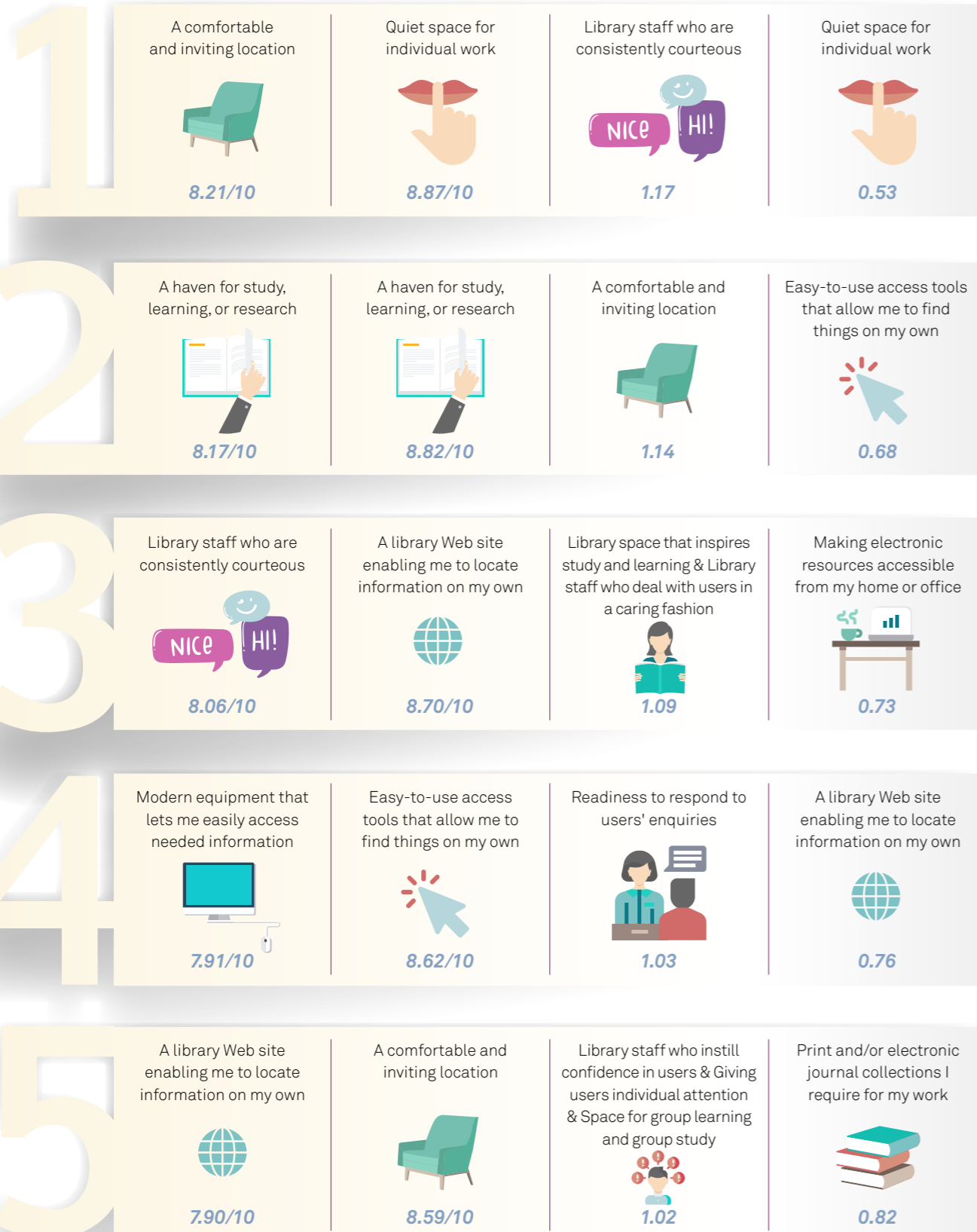

### Explore the new Music Library at Chung Chi College Library

In response to the changing needs for your learning, teaching and research, we are excited to share with you that the entire Chung Chi College Library Second Floor has been fully refurbished to include a purpose built Music Library with soundproof listening rooms. The 2/F has been renovated to house the significant music and audio visual collection of over 110,000 items. These items include the Pian collection, audio visual collections relocated from the United College Library, and over 7,000 audio CDs previously held by the Music Department. ### Research Poster Exhibition 2019 Extending the Reach of Postgraduates' Research

Co-organised by the CUHK Library, the Graduate School and the Independent Learning Centre (ILC), the [Research Poster Exhibition \(RPE\) 2019](#) for CUHK postgraduates was held in the University Library from 8 to 30 May and from 11 to 15 June in the Yasumoto International Academic (YIA) Park. This was the first time that the Exhibition was held in the YIA Park. The Exhibition aimed at extending the reach of postgraduates' research to the university community and providing participants opportunities to enhance their academic presentation skills.

The exhibition this year selected 20 posters submitted by our postgraduates across six faculties, of whom 17 are at PhD level. The participants welcomed this platform for cross-disciplinary academic exchanges. They presented their research to the audience and competed for three Best Poster Presentation Awards in the oral presentation held on 16 May. Prof. Lutz-Christian Wolff, Dean of the Graduate School with two other judges, Dr. Karl Holm, Lecturer of ILC, and Ms. Louise Jones, University Librarian, headed the honoured panel of judges.

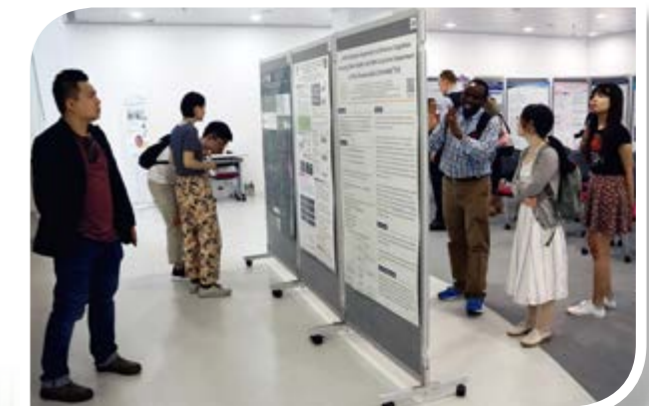

#### *What do you do at the Library?*

I work closely with faculty members and students to develop library collections and services in supporting the educational and research needs of the Faculty of Medicine.

#### *What is your educational background and work experience?*

I studied Optometry for my undergraduate and postgraduate studies in Hong Kong and obtained my Master Degree in Information Studies in Australia. Prior to joining CUHK, I have worked in local academic libraries, serving librarian positions in information services and access services area.

#### *What are you responsible for?*

I also provide instructional

Apart from library management, I work closely with the research community of the Faculty of Medicine to support the research cycle through advanced and systematic literature searching, scholarly publishing, scholarly identity management, research data management, and citation analysis.
