Please note that:

- 1. This is a 3-unit course offered by the Office of Academic Links to international students who wish to engage in a short-term project supervised by CUHK faculty member. Students taking this course are required to write a research paper on a topic in international studies under the supervision of an academic staff member.
- 2. Grade descriptor is detailed as below:
 - A: Outstanding performance on all learning outcomes.
 - A-: Generally outstanding performance on all (or almost all) learning outcomes.
 - B: Substantial performance on all learning outcomes, OR high performance on some learning outcomes which compensates for less satisfactory performance on others, resulting in overall substantial performance.
 - C: Satisfactory performance on the majority of learning outcomes, possibly with a few weaknesses.
 - D: Barely satisfactory performance on a number of learning outcomes.
 - F: Unsatisfactory performance on a number of learning outcomes, OR failure to meet specified assessment requirements.
