Content of the Workshop



Professor Ho took the lead to participate in the first 6 cycles of PISA (PISA 2000+, 2003, 2006, 2009, 2012 & 2015), which is a triennial international study organized by the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD). Most importantly, Prof HO initiated a follow-up ten-year longitudinal study (HKLSA) for tracing the transition patterns of participating students from 2012 to 2022.

Building on the valuable lessons we learned from PISA and HKLSA, Prof HO has started another international study - the Health Behaviour in School-aged Children (HBSC) in 2018. Co-ordinated by the World Health Organization (WHO) Regional Office for Europe, the HBSC is a cross-national study conducted every four years. It aims to investigate the health behaviour and well-being of 11, 13 and 15-year-old students and related factors, including family and social contexts, and to compare the physical and mental health of young people at different stages and in different countries. The HBSC is now participated in by over 40 countries and regions. This is the first time that Hong Kong has participated in the HBSC Main Study in 2020, which can serve as a benchmark for assessing Hong Kong students' health and well-being. The study was supported by the Public Policy Research Funding Scheme from the Policy Innovation and Co-ordination Office of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region Government and has a good potential to collaborate with Mainland China for the next round of HBSC study.

This workshop will start with a brief review from PISA to HKLSA. Then Prof HO will share some interesting findings of HKLSA & HBSC. The professional principles and basic strategies for implementing large scale international studies will be highlighted, which could be useful for designing and preparing for a 4 star impact case. It is hoped that our research could benefit not only the researchers, but also the policy makers, educators, parents and the general public in the field of education.
