THEO 5002: Graduate Thesis I

1st Term 2022-2023; Friday 9:30-11:15am, CCT T31

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I. <u>Aim of the Course</u>

This course is designed to facilitate M.Div./BD students in their graduate thesis writing. Students are to write a graduate thesis of 20,000 words under the supervision of their individual thesis supervisor. They are expected to submit their thesis on time by the end of May 2023. It is important to note that late submission may lead to a delay in graduation.

II. <u>Learning Outcomes:</u>

Following the instruction by and timetable set by this course and the guidance of individual thesis supervisor, students are expected to meet the following learning outcomes:

- 1. Knowledge Outcomes:
 - In-depth understanding of the chosen topic in theological studies;
 - Research on and organization of primary and secondary materials;

2. Skills Outcomes:

- Developing a concrete, relevant, and sounded research topic;
- Conducting an independent research;
- Demonstrate a basic academic writing skill;
- 3. Attitude Outcomes:
 - Familiar with and aware of survey research and publication ethics.

III. <u>Learning Activities</u>

A) <u>Lectures:</u>

Lectures/individual advisory meetings/group seminars are scheduled in some weeks. The eLearning system Blackboard/group email will serve as a discussion and information exchange forum.

- B) <u>Seminars:</u> Students will be divided into two groups for the seminars.
- C) <u>Meetings with thesis supervisor:</u> Students shall meet/communicate with their individual thesis supervisor no less than two times during the first semester.
- <u>Additional meeting by appointment:</u> Outside of the scheduled lectures and seminars, students are welcomed to make an appointment for individual or group discussion/meeting with the course instructor.

IV. Assessment Scheme (based on Paper-Grading Rubric System)

- 1. Thesis Proposal 30% Thesis proposal shall include 1) thesis title, 2) research aim and question, 3) a brief literature review, 4) tentative thesis, 5) table of content, and 6) bibliography.
- 2. Format & Citation and Plagiarism Quizzes 10%
- First Complete Chapter (any chapter, 8-10 pages) 30%
 [Assessment: Arguments (7%), Counter-Arguments (3%), Analysis (7%);
 Organization (5%), Writing Style (5%), Citation and Format (3%)]
- One Response to a Classmate's Work 5%
 Each student is to submit one written response of a thesis proposal by a classmate.
- 5. Two Summary Reports of Meetings with Supervisor 20% (@10%) Each student is to meet his/her thesis supervisor regularly and at least three times. Two written reports of the supervisory sessions are to be submitted on 4 November 2022 and 2 December 2022 respectively. Each report shall consist of a one-paragraph summary of the supervisors' advice and/or comments.
- Participation 5%
 Should a foreseeable event occur that may result in tardiness or absence, the student is required to notice the instructor in advance. Unexcused tardiness or absence would lead to mark deduction.
- * The course instructor will suggest a final grade to the supervisor based on the assessment scheme, but the supervisor may adjust the grade according to the academic potential of the research thesis and individual learning paces.
- V. <u>Other Instructions</u>
 - Student shall invite a **full-time Divinity School teacher** to be his/her thesis supervisor. Exceptional case must be approved by the Graduate Thesis course instructor.
 - Presentation and group discussion of thesis proposal follow the same pattern of the Faculty-Student Seminar.
 - Students shall present according to the presentation schedule.

- For the rundown of each presentation, see Class Schedule above.
- Presenters shall submit their works 5 days before the presentation (on Monday).
- Respondents are required to submit a one-page written response the day before the presentation.
- VeriGuide submission is not required until the final complete draft in May 2023.
- All assignments shall be submitted to Group Discussion Forum on Blackboard. Deduction of marks may apply to late submission:
