# Basic Requirements

- A Bachelor's degree from a recognized university (second honor or above) or a Master's degree
- English proficiency
- Application form
- Two recommendation letters

## Department's Requirements

- Research proposal (5 pages in English)
- Up to two academic writing sample(s) in English/Chinese/Japanese (if any)
- Japanese proficiency
- Interview for shortlisted candidates

#### **Postgraduate Studentships**

- For full-time research postgraduate students
- Annual studentship for 2022-23: HK\$216,300
- Payable throughout the normative study period

#### **Postgraduate Scholarships**


 The Reaching Out Award, Research Postgraduate Student Grants for Overseas Academic Activities and other funding schemes are available to support full-time MPhil and PhD students who are conducting academic activities abroad.

# Tuition Waiver Scheme (By Government)

- Starting from the 2018-19 academic year
- For Local Full-Time RPg students enrolled in UGC-funded RPg programmes
- For entire normative study period

#### Hong Kong PhD Fellowship Scheme (HKPFS)

The Hong Kong PhD Fellowship Scheme (HKPFS), established by the RGC, aims to attract the best and brightest students from across the globe to pursue their PhD studies in Hong Kong universities.



PhD candidates who are nominated by CUHK to HKPFS but not selected by the RGC will be admitted to the University's regular PhD programme with postgraduate studentship. They will also receive the **CUHK Vice-Chancellor's PhD Scholarship of HK\$80,000** (payable in three instalments) subject to satisfactory study progress.

# Other Alternatives

- Self-funded M.Phil (full-time or part-time)
- Self-funded Ph.D program (full-time or parttime)
- HK\$42,100 per annum regardless of the study mode
