The Master of Arts in Japanese Studies offers training in topics related to Japanese society, culture, history, and language and enables students to better prepare themselves for further studies or careers in directions related to Japan.

Programme Objectives

The MA Programme in Japanese Studies aims to provide a rigorous education in Japanese studies from inter-disciplinary and multi-disciplinary perspectives for students who have not majored in Japanese studies or Japanese language programmes, and for students who have majored in Japanese studies and who would like to build upon their knowledge with advanced study in specialized topics.

At the conclusion of this taught postgraduate program, students will be able to:

- 1. identify and critically analyze major social science theories and approaches used in the study of Japanese society and culture;
- 2. identify and articulate key social and cultural issues affecting modern Japan;
- 3. recognize and apply appropriate approaches in understanding a variety of social and cultural issues in Japan;

Applicants who have graduated from a recognized university and obtained a bachelor's degree, normally with honours not lower than Second Class will be considered, and <u>prior knowledge</u> of Japanese language and culture is encouraged but not required.
