My hometown is Zhanjiang. There are many local festivals in Zhanjiang. The biggest festival here, for Chinese people, is of course the Chinese New Year. Zhanjiang has a special way to celebrate the Chinese New Year which is called "Nianli". In Hong Kong, there is a saying that Winter Solstice Festival is more important than the Chinese New Year, while in Zhanjiang, it is Nianli that matters more. Nianli as a traditional way of celebrating the New Year is popular not only in Zhanjiang, but also in West Guangdong, including Maoming, Wuchuan and other places have similar celebration customs. Nianli's activities include "Qi Nianli" (the start), "Zheng Nianli" (the middle) and "Wei Nianli" (the end). It has roots in tradition and represents some beliefs which are associated with gods connected with the sea. It shows blessings and expectations for the coming year. "Greeting the Gods" is an important part of Nianli. It involves

welcoming God into one's home at one's ancestral temple. The second event is the Piu Sik parade. Some children wear theatrical costumes and a lot of makeup. They are on the float, and they can't move around on it. They parade around the main streets of the city. Some people pay them a courtesy or give money to the people on the parade for their efforts. Another important thing is that they invite guests to their village or home for a big dinner. The feast is rich. So when we talk about the Chinese New Year, we think of giving red envelopes. But if a friend invites you to the village for dinner during Nianli, there is no need to do it. Regarding Leizhou, which is my hometown, there is a local opera called Leiju. It is similar to Yueju (Cantonese Opera), but the language is different. People specially invite troupes who sing Leiju plays, and they usually perform in the village opera houses. The above is the introduction of Nianli in Zhanjiang.
