# Message from the Programme Director **Professor ZHAN Jing Vivian**

Drastic historical changes are descending with the rise of China. A look at the world history tells us that each time when a power rises, it generates shocks that impact on even the far corners of the world. Living in the 21st century, we are destined to witness the arrival of a new era. Then the question is: how do we position ourselves and prepare for the extraordinary uncertainties ahead? To understand what a rising China means and prepare for the upcoming challenges, it is crucial to unpack the gigantic entity that's called Greater China, including its political institutions and thoughts, economic system and development, social structures and movements, internal relations between the Mainland, Hong Kong, Taiwan and Macao, and external relations with the outside world. Only when we understand where China comes from, can we make informed judgment about where it goes in the future.



Against this background, the MSSc Programme in Government and Politics (Greater China) was launched in 2012 to provide a platform for students to learn about the aforementioned aspects of Greater China, engage in intellectual dialogue and exploration with established scholars, and develop the capabilities of independent and critical thinking based on rigorous methods and from multiple angels. Our graduates are now pursuing divergent and flourishing careers in public service, civil society, academia, media, business etc. In the years to come, the GPGC programme will continue to train forward-looking Greater China analysts with a global vision, independent thinking, and methodological rigor. They will be equipped with the knowledge to turn the formidable challenges into precious opportunities for not only the advancement of their own careers but also the betterment of the whole society.

#### Programme Highlights

MSSc Programme in Government and Politics (Greater China)

- Has a broader geographical and thematic coverage than most of Master of Art programmes in China Studies. Geographically it covers Greater China (Mainland China, Taiwan, Hong Kong and Macao). Thematically it provides unique insights into major subjects, such as institution & reform, public administration, foreign policies & regional international relations, democracy & rule of law, environmental politics, state-society relations, and political communications.
- Emphasizes social science perspective and research methodology
- Taught by faculty of the GPA Department and renowned scholars from Greater China and overseas
- Offered in English and Mandarin Chinese, aiming at preparing students to take on active leadership roles in the region and beyond
