Top Mathematicians Gather to Discuss Directions of Mathematical Research in China

Mathematicians from the US, Japan, mainland China, Taiwan, and Hong Kong gathered at the International Conference on Perspectives of Mathematical Research in China for the 21st Century, organized by the Institute of Mathematical Sciences (IMS) of the University in the Cho Yiu Conference Hall from 28th to 30th May 2001. The aim of the conference was to discuss the strategic directions of future mathematical research in China.

At the opening ceremony of the conference, the IMS and the Department of Mathematics signed academic collaboration agreements with eight prestigious academic institutions, namely, the University of Science and Technology of China, the Academy of Mathematics and Systems Sciences of the Chinese Academy of Sciences, Tsinghua University (Hsinchu), Chiao Tung University (Hsinchu), Nanjing University, Zhongshan University, National University of Singapore, and the Mathematical Sciences Research Institute of Berkeley, California.

On the same occasion, representatives from Harvard University and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology introduced their new exchange scholarships with the IMS.

The IMS has been established for over five years with a mission to promote interdisciplinary research in the mathematical sciences and to nurture young scientists for both Hong Kong and China. Its activities have been supported by very substantial donations from Mr. Robert Kuok of the Kerry Group and Dr. Li Ka Shing of Cheung Kong (Holdings) and Hutchinson Whampao.

Officiating at the opening ceremony were Dr. Alice Lam, chair of the University Grants Committee, Mr. Robert Kuok, Dr. Li Ka Shing, Prof. Arthur K.C. Li, vice-chancellor of the University, and Prof. Yau Shing-tung, director of IMS.

M any students of the University have benefited from scholarships that enable them to go abroad for further studies and academic exchange. Some are the winners of highly competitive and prestigious scholarships, such as the Rhodes Scholarship, the Sir Edward Youde Memorial Fellowships for Overseas Studies, scholarships from the Jockey Club Music and Dance Fund, and the Hong Kong Bank Foundation Overseas Scholarship.

To express the University's immense gratitude to the donors who have made possible these learning opportunities to the students, a Soaring Dragons presentation ceremony was held on 31st May 2001 at the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre. There were over 200 participants including guests, awardees and their parents. Dr. Alice Lam, chair of the University Grants Committee, officiated at the ceremony. She joined Prof. Arthur K.C. Li, vice-chancellor of the University, in presenting souvenirs to the donors. Three scholarship recipients were invited to share their learning experience overseas with the audience.

According to the records of the Office of Student Affairs, over 1,000 outstanding CUHK students have won scholarships in 2000–1 for overseas studies, short-term tours, and exchange visits in countries including the UK, USA, Australia, Canada, Japan, and Sweden. The overseas experience is expected to broaden their perspective and increase their sensitivity to intercultural differences.

New Teaching and Research Centre Opens as Faculty of Medicine Celebrates 20th Anniversary

The Postgraduate Education Centre of the Faculty of Medicine was officially opened at the Prince of Wales Hospital on 2nd June 2001. The new building houses state-of-the-art conference facilities for the Faculty of Medicine and Hong Kong's first ever School of Public Health. The construction of the centre was made possible by the generous donations of the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust, the Shaw Foundation, the Friends of Prince of Wales Hospital, and Kai Chong Tong.

The opening of the centre also marked the 20th anniversary of the Faculty of Medicine. It is a big step forward in its effort to strengthen medical continuing education and to contribute to the advancement of public health through education, training, and research.

Officiating at the opening ceremony were Dr. E.K. Yeoh, Secretary for Health and Welfare of the HKSAR government; Mr. Alan F.S. Li, chairman of the Hong Kong Jockey Club; Ms. Mona Fong, the Shaw Foundation Hong Kong; representatives of the Friends of Prince of Wales Hospital and Kai Chong Tong; and Prof. Arthur K.C. Li, vice-chancellor of the University.

On the evening of the same day, the 20th Anniversary Gala Dinner of the Faculty of Medicine was held at the Grand Hall in Phase 2 of the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre.

Educational Reform Under Probe

Q uestions as to how school-based management should be implemented, how new immigrant students can fit into our education system, whether our students respect their teachers, and whether our teachers are competent enough, were dealt with at the International Conference on Rejuvenating Schools Through Partnership, held from 22nd to 24th May 2001 in the Esther Lee Building. The event was organized by the Centre for University and School Partnership of the Faculty of Education and the Hong Kong Institute of

Educational Research of the University, in collaboration with the Education Department of the HKSAR, and various school councils in Hong Kong. It was sponsored by the Quality Education Fund.



The conference provided an opportunity for the synthesis of ideas and efforts. Experts intimately involved in important school reform projects in Asia, Australia, Europe, and North America shared their insight and experience with the participants under sub-themes such as innovative models and programmes through partnerships, curriculum and instructional innovations in schools, reforming the occupational conditions of teaching, and reforming the relationship between schools and their clients.

Officiating at the opening ceremony of the conference was Mr. Matthew Cheung, director of education of the HKSAR.

Management Programme Jointly Offered with Top Business Schools

The Faculty of Business Administration is now offering GLOBE, a global advanced management programme, jointly with three top business schools: the Stern School of Business of New York University, HEC of Paris, and Fundação Getulio Vargas (FGV) of Sao Paulo, Brazil. GLOBE provides a unique professional development experience for high-level executives in an authentic global environment.

The programme will be delivered in four one-week segments, each in a different city. It is to open in New York with an examination of the New Economy of innovation and finance. The Hong Kong segment will address risk and opportunity in emerging economies. In Paris, the programme will deal with the building and control of global organizations. It will conclude in Sao Paulo with the management of globalization and cultural diversity. In between segments, participants will work on group projects, applying the concepts they have learnt to their own organizations.

The Stern School of Business is a world leader in business education, while HEC is France's leading business school and one of the most renowned in Europe, and FGV was founded with the support of both the Brazilian and the US governments.

Awards for Translation Studies

Results for the 2001 Stephen C. Soong Translation Studies Memorial Awards were announced following an adjudicator's meeting on 25th May 2001. The adjudicators were Prof. David Pollard, Dr. Mary Fung, Prof. Wang Kefei, and Dr. Eva Hung. The winners are Li Defeng (The Chinese University of Hong Kong), whose thesis is titled 'Tailoring Translation Programmes to Social Needs: A Survey of Professional Translators', and Zhu Chunshen (City University of Hong Kong), whose thesis is on 'Perception and Cognition in Translating Chinese Landscape Poetry: A Case Study of Liu Zongyuan's poem *River Show, Etudes sur le Texte et Ses Transformations*'.

Wang Dongfeng (Nanjing University) received an honourable mention for 'The Cultural Positioning of Translated Literature and the Cultural Standpoint of the Translator'.

Orchestra from U Penn Performs at CUHK

The University of Pennsylvania Symphony Orchestra gave a concert in Sir Run Run Shaw Hall on 30th May as the last leg of their Millennium Tour of China. All proceeds from the concert went towards the Penn Scholars Programme, which sponsors Hong Kong students on exchange to the University of Pennsylvania. 

How Useful in Reality Is the Virtual Classroom?

Students and Teachers Share Their Thoughts on Web-based Teaching

The Web-based teaching (WBT) platform (http:// www.cuhk.edu.hk/wbt), which consists of three interrelated tools: WebCT, CU Forum, and Webbased teaching links, was launched by the Information Technology Services Centre (ITSC) last August. The platform accommodates course materials, online tutorials, teaching calendars, exercises, quizzes, assignment submission, student progress tracking and assessment, discussion forums, and a master index to all online courses of the University.

As of March 2001, approximately 750 courses published their web links in the master index. And a total of 480 WebCT courses and 214 discussion groups in CU Forum were created.

To familiarize teachers with WBT and to enable them to acquire the skills for using it, the ITSC has organized instructor-led workshops. Two self-paced and web-based WebCT training courses are also in place to allow teachers to learn WebCT on their own. Teachers who have used


WBT have also been invited to share their experience with their colleagues at seminars and workshops targeted at individual faculties.

To nurture a culture of self-support, a WBT Community consisting of 82 members has been established. Members help one another solve technical problems concerning the WBT platform. They also have a forum for discussion, a monthly digest, and weekly tips, etc. A similar group is the WBT Pioneer, a mailing list of teaching staff who have been pioneers at this university in applying IT to teaching. They share among themselves their web-based teaching experience as well as resources, such as good articles about WBT and useful tools.

An important factor determining the effectiveness of WBT is how course materials and multimedia technology are integrated. As the ITSC holds the key to the technical side of the matter, it offers a courseware design and

development service using multimedia technologies. In the process of designing the courseware, the ITSC (Academic Support Team) maintains close communication with the user, who could be a teacher, faculty, or college, in order to have a clear understanding of the content side of the matter. English Phonetic Transcription is one of the latest web-based courses developed by the team. Encompassing multimedia technologies including animation, games, online exercises, video, 3D modelling, this course serves close to 4,000 students. In the coming academic year, web-based Cantonese and putonghua phonetic transcription courses will be launched.

To give some idea of how useful WBT has been to those who have used it, the CUHK Newsletter has invited four teachers and two students to share their experience of and views on WBT with our readers.



Comments from Students

Eileen Lie, Year 3, Geography

I have been using WebCT for a year. I think it is a useful tool for web-based teaching.

When we enter WebCT, the first thing we need to do is to enter our login name and password. I don't like this requirement because it is a waste of time. Whenever I want to go to WebCT, I have to re-enter my login name and password before I can use it. Besides, I cannot go to the web-pages of the courses I have not registered for, and because of this I cannot gain as much knowledge through WebCT as I would like to.

There are some special functions in WebCT such as private mails, drop box, calendar, chat rooms, and so on. I think they are useful and interesting because they allow me to contact my classmates and teachers easily. However, they are less convenient than regular e-mail which allows me to contact my classmates and teachers without having to enter WebCT.

Another problem for me is I do not know how to use all the functions. For example, till now I don't know how to use drop box to hand in my homework because no one has taught me how to do it. Also, my teachers never ask me to submit my homework using the drop box. And if my English Language Teaching lecturer had not taught me how to use the chat rooms and the bulletin board, I do not think I would have been using them either.

Pear Yeung Ho-cheung, Year 2, Economics

I have been using CU Forum since Year One. It was introduced to me by one of my hall-mates. I usually read the messages in the newsgroup rather than post them. As I want to know more about what is going on in the University, CU Forum provides a good place for me. People usually talk about their daily lives, love affairs, or even political issues. Sometimes it is quite interesting, but some materials are very boring. Once I found two students using the newsgroup as if it were ICQ; they were discussing something that only the two of them understood. They have abused the forum,

There may be more than 300 new messages in the newsgroup a day and it is very time-consuming to read all of them. So, I would only read those I am interested in and which I think are important. As the president of the Student Council of the United College Student Union, I sometimes need to post the agenda or collect the opinion of my fellow students about certain issues. CU Forum is really helpful for this purpose. I can get the information I need quickly and directly. I can also print out the messages if I find

Although the forum is very user-friendly, I do think one improvement is needed — the deletion of wrongly typed messages in the forum. Typing mistakes are common and sometimes people may be misled by your typos, which could even lead to arguments. The only thing I can do in such a case is to post another message,

but it may already be too late.

Comments from Teachers

Mr. George Jor, **English Language Teaching Unit**

My personal experience of CU Forum began from the time the system was launched in 2000. I have been using it as a supplementary tool to enhance an English Language Teaching (ELT) course 'Technical Communications' (http:// humanum.arts.cuhk.edu.hk/~cmc/1111). On the average, there are six course instructors and about 200 to 300 engineering and science students per semester in the course. In the fall semester of 2000, there were 16 sections with an average of 20 students per section and a total of 329 students. I have served as the course coordinator and web contact, offering tailor-made CU Forum induction meetings for my colleagues and their classes.

CU Forum has four main features. First, the Messages feature allows me to post, and for students to read, the course instructions and announcements. Second, the Files feature enables me to distribute lecture notes, marking schemes, and good writing models for students' reference. Students find the marking schemes and assignment instructions useful and know what is being expected of them before they do the assignments. Teachers find good writing models and students' 'A' grade assignments helpful as a kind of feedback enriched with models when discussing the returned assignments with the class. The enriched feedback helps students raise their standards. Third, the Links feature makes it possible for the teacher and students to share web links to useful online resources with brief explanations for the recommendation. Fourth, the Members feature helps students and teachers locate class members' e-mail addresses easily.

I would like to make a few enhancement suggestions. First, user education is important for both teachers and students alike. I have learned a lot from the ITSC seminars on CU Forum and used it in the induction meetings for my students. I attended a recent seminar hosted by Stanley Yuen, Christina Keing, Tess Li, and Ivan Sin on 21st March 2001, and found it very useful. There were demonstrations, summaries, trouble-shooting highlights, sorting messages by ASCII code order, hands-on experience, and useful FAQs. I have no hesitation in recommending it to other teachers. I am pleased to learn that the ITSC is making continuous improvement on the tool such as on how to let teachers move files more easily, e-mail functions, and daily summaries. I hope there will also be a slight change in the user interface, that is, My CU Forum should be put before the Forum List. The reason is obvious. When reading English, people tend to read from top to bottom and from left to right. For the user, it represents an intuitive design of customization and priority, in other words, putting first things first.

Another enhancement suggestion is for the students' consideration - active learning with new technology like CU Forum is the key to survival in a knowledge-based economy. A positive attitude and a mindset for life-long learning can be their asset and become their ultimate protection in a changing world. Students should not merely look for easy grades or avoid taking risks or shy away from new courseware.

Sometimes, to look for innovative solutions to our learning problems, we need to think beyond the box. It is in our interest to take some risks, to live and learn on the edge of chaos between too much and too few structure. To sum up my experience of using new technologies for teaching, it has been an experiment in active learning.

Prof. Fu Ping-ping, Department of Management

My

I started using the web when I was teaching in the US. So when I came here in 1998, I asked the staff from the computer centre if there was any software that I could use for running discussions. They did not have one then, but were going to start one. So I became an experimental user.

I started with the WebBoard and used it for my principal management course. I had students post discussion guestions and called it our 'class extension'. Students who used it enjoyed it, so I have kept that as part of the class ever since. The following semester, when the University adopted the WebCT software, I became a trial user again.

I have used it for my undergraduate as well as MBA students. Most of the time, I use it as a supplementary tool to continue discussions from the 'real' class, to let students exchange ideas and ask questions. My MBA students who have to travel overseas during class time use it to keep track of the class progress because I also load class notes

To help students gain experience working in the virtual environment, I have also joined faculty members from several other universities across the world in organizing cross-cultural Internet projects for the students to work on.

This semester, I am teaching a human resources management class. In addition to discussion on topics we have covered in class, I also ask students to post current issues in the news that are related to human resources management. Students have provided a lot of interesting and important topics and the discussions have definitely Netscape: Web-based Teaching and Learning Home Page

helped them connect what we learn in class with what happens in the real world. I would not say that the use of the web has helped every one of my students, however. I would only say that most of the students who have been actively participating have enjoyed using the web. I have 110 students in my two classes. The total messages have exceeded 1,300.



Prof. Ho Man-koon, Department of Curriculum and Instruction

I began developing web-based teaching for a Chinese language course about two years ago. I believe that it can enhance the effectiveness of both teaching and learning through the interaction and exchange between students and teachers. I also believe that web-based teaching can increase student motivation and enable them to learn on their own. The course materials on this website is learnercentred, with a design based on theories in cognitive psychology. Some people believe it is very difficult and inefficient for Chinese to be taught on the Internet. However, the experiences of my students and myself have proved that web-based teaching of Chinese is beneficial for both teacher and student. Besides being flexible in terms of time and location, web-based teaching also allows teachers to give appropriate advice to students and to assess their performance.

Prof. Fan Sin-piu, Department of Chinese Language and Literature

我是上學期初開始使用 CU Forum 的。在這之前我 有一個自己的網頁,貼上了一些課程大綱、教材、學 生的和自己的文章,網頁上也有一個留言版,是那種 最普通的類型。我本來希望學生和其他朋友可以在留 言版上進行一些課外交流,或者延續課堂上的討論, 可是效果並不理想。不是留言太少,而是留言版的功 能不夠用,首先是留言不能按照話題分類排列,看起 來很混亂,其次是留言者的身份無法確認,可以用假 名,甚至每次署上不同的名字。後來大學的電腦技術 人員建議我試用新推出的 CU Forum, 我就用兩個課程 的名義開了三個論壇, 下學期我又開了另外兩個, 也 介紹了系內同事試用。

CU Forum 在某程度上解決了以上的問題,但對教學 有多大幫助,則要看課程設計和師生與趣而定。以下 學期的兩個課程為例,一個是七十人的大學通識課, 我把講義分期放在網上,讓學生下載,省去印發的麻 煩,但網上提問的人不多,通常是詢問習作和考試的 要求。另一個是小班的文藝寫作課,我要求學生把習 作貼到 CU Forum 上,選出一部份在課上討論,另一部 份則自由閱讀;留言方面,可以延續課堂上未討論完 的話題,也可以就沒有討論過的的習作發言。雖然難 免有些插科打諢的話,但因為系統會顯示真實姓名 所以留言較有分寸,氣氛也頗熱烈,甚至有些沒有修 讀的同學也會發言。同學交流的機會多了,認識較 深,上課時的氣氛也融洽些。總括來說, CU Forum 的 效果還是要看同學的投入程度,但它起碼提供了一個 課外聯繫的機會。

The Way Ahead

The ITSC recognizes the necessity of measuring the effectiveness of WBT and idenfitying its niche areas in order to justify sustainable long-term resource injection. With this in mind, it held a seminar last month, 'Assessing the Consequences of Information Technology in Education: Issues, Problems, and Opportunities'. Prof. Roger Yin of the University of Wisconsin — Whitewater, an expert in the area, was invited to speak on the consequences of using technology in course delivery, and the issue of linking computer technology to the scholarship of teaching. A set of pre- and post-course surveys are also in place to evaluate the effectiveness of web-based teaching.

And while the current WBT platform will remain the major delivery platform at the University, the ITSC has pledged to continuously explore new and better course delivery technologies and platforms.

本校參與開設環球管理課程

校工商管理學院與紐約大學史端商學院、巴黎HEC商科研究院及聖保羅熱圖利奧·巴爾加斯基金會合辦一個環球管理課程,名為「GLOBE」。課程特點是營造一個真實的環球商業環境,供頂尖行政人員獨特的專業發展體驗。課程採四節制,每節一星期,分別於四地舉行。

課程將於八月在紐約開展,集中 檢視新經濟下的創意及財經;而在香 港,則以新經濟的風險及契機為主 題;在巴黎,學員將會研習環球機構 的建立及監控;在聖保羅,以全球一 體化及文化分歧的管理方法為結。在 節與節間,學員會以小組個案形式將 所學的理念,應用於他們服務的機 構。

紐約史端商學院是全球首屈一指的商學院,不少校友更是美國公司的高級行政主管。巴黎HEC商科研究院是法國及歐洲的最優秀商學院,與商業社團保持密切連繫,校友遍布五十多個國家。熱圖利奧·巴爾加斯基金會巴西聖保羅分校是該會五所分校中最大者,獲巴西及美國政府大力支持,是巴西管理教育的先驅。

市民看房屋政策及樓市前景

港亞太研究所電話調查研究室上月十四至十六日,以隨機抽樣方式,訪問了 逾千名成年市民,探討他們對特區政府房屋政策的態度。

該所所長楊汝萬教授及研究統籌員王家英博士本月一日在利黃瑤璧樓公布調查結果,要點如下:

- (一) 市民對特區政府的整體房屋政策頗為不滿。
- (二) 六成半受訪者認為政府沒有必要協助負資產業主;市民的福利主義傾向並不強烈。
- (三)七成七受訪者認為特區政府應該繼續興建居屋;約一半人不滿居屋的素質。
- (四)高達九成的受訪者認為政府應該繼續興建公屋;六成二人贊成政府出售公屋的計劃。市民對公屋的素質相對地感到滿意,但對其管理服務則相對地感到不滿。
- (五)市民懷疑新近成立的市區重建局能否有效解決舊區重建的問題;但逾半人認 為市區重建局的收樓賠償基準合理。
- (六)八成二受訪者贊成政府的首次置業貸款計劃。
- (七)對於香港樓市前景,五成二人表示悲觀,但仍有約一成七受訪者透露有意在 未來兩年在香港買樓或換樓。約一成人計劃未來兩年在內地買樓,近一成三 更已在內地置業。

美大學交響樂團在中大演奏

■ 國賓夕法尼亞大學交響樂團五月三十日晚在邵逸夫堂舉行「中國世紀之旅 — 西方音樂與北京京劇的結合」音樂會,演奏多支西洋古典樂曲,並與著名京劇藝術家孫萍合作演出一些樣板戲,嘗試結合中西音樂,為古典音樂注入新元素。

音樂會由本校及香港港龍航空公司贊助,門票收入將贈予該校的香港校友會 設立獎學金,用以資助到費城深造的交換學生,中大的商科學生亦是受惠者。

促進長者健康

校運動醫學暨促進健康中心 為二百名長者測試體能,當 中一半人須接受十二星期的運動訓練。結果顯示,接受運動訓練者在 四肢的肌耐力及柔軟度均明顯增強。

該等訓練參考運動醫學及科學的理論和臨床經驗而制訂,並能配合香港的居住環境及長者的日常生活習慣。該中心上月三十日舉行記者會介紹詳情(上圖),並透露會將新設計的健體方法推廣至全港三百多間長者中心。

另,護理學系上月十九日參加 安老事務委員會在香港會議展覽中 心舉辦的「康健樂頤年大會」(下 圖),並以「促進耆年照顧者之健康」 為主題,展覽有關訊息。



探索校園更生良方

了了 洲、澳洲、歐洲和北美等地都在進行重大的學校改革,以開創新世紀的教育路向。本校上月廿二至廿四日在利黃瑤璧樓召開「攜手更生校園」國際研討會,匯聚各地積極參與學校改革的專家,透過經驗分享以凝聚力量和激發新意念,促進香港的教育改革。討論課題包括以協作方式進行的改革模式和計劃,學校課程與教學改革,教學工作條件的改革,以及學校與服務對象關係的改革。

會議由教育學院大學與學校夥伴協作中心和香港教育研究所合辦,香港教育署和多個學校議會、聯會協辦,並得到優質教育基金贊助。

網頁設計須重視用家行為模式

理學系夏偉立教授的研究顯示,網 頁設計者沒有考慮用家的行為模式,例如感官、專注力及記憶力等,平白 錯失互聯網帶來的商機。

他的研究發現,很多用家進入網頁 後,都會遇到各種困難,終而放棄網上購 物。許多網頁設計者認為很好的網頁,其 實對一般用家來說是太複雜及混亂。

夏偉立教授本月五日在信和樓召開簡 布會,介紹其研究及分析結果,並講述網

上廣告點擊率偏低的原因,以及語文運用對用家的影響等。

中國數學展望國際研討會

學科學研究所上月廿八至三十日在祖堯堂主辦「二十一世紀中國數學的展望」 國際研討會,集合歐美、新加坡和兩岸三地的頂尖數學家,共同探討中國數 學研究的發展方向。

開幕禮由大學教育資助委員會主席林李翹如博士、嘉里集團主席郭鶴年先 生、長江實業(集團)有限公司及和記黃埔有限公司董事局主席李嘉誠博士、李國 章校長及數學科學研究所所長丘成桐教授主持。

丘成桐教授鄭重指出,數學科學研究所的創立及運作,與郭鶴年先生和李嘉誠博士的大力支持密不可分。另外,Quantrix Limited 總裁Mr. William Benter及時富投資集團有公司主席關百豪先生等社會知名人士亦慷慨贊助該所的研究活動。

在典禮上,數學科學研究所及數學系又與中國科學技術大學、中國科學院數學與系統科學研究院、清華大學(新竹)、交通大學(新竹)、南京大學、中山大學、新加坡國立大學及美國加州柏克萊數學科學研究所簽署學術合作協議。哈佛大學及麻省理工學院的代表則介紹兩校與數學科學研究所合作設立的數學交流獎學金計劃。

去年全日制本科畢業生就業率高 應屆會計畢業生獲多份五大聘書

校二零零零年度全日制本科畢業 生的就業調查結果顯示,截至去 年底,近九成八的畢業生找到工作或 繼續升學,他們的平均月薪為一萬三 千三百多元。

大學輔導長鄭振耀教授表示,去 屆每名畢業生平均接獲兩份聘書,當 中九成六於去年九月底前已獲聘任。 畢業生的平均月薪較前一年的增加百 分之五,其中以從事管理顧問行業薪 金最高,平均月薪為四萬六千六百多 元。調查於去年十一至十二月進行, 調查範圍不包括醫科及護理學畢業 生,回應率為百分之八十點五。

畢業生加入工商界的比率最高,達 百分之七十六點四,僱主大部分是本地 的中、小型機構;而加入教育界的佔百 分之十三點九,社會及公共服務界百分 之六點八,政府部門百分之二點九。受 僱比率最高的五個行業為電腦、資訊科 技及電子商貿(百分之十七點九),教育 (百分之九點九),會計(百分之八點 八),市場推廣(百分之八點六),以及 行政及管理(百份之五點八)。

另,會計學院的調查顯示,該院 二零零一年全日制會計專業畢業生就 業情況非常理想,畢業生每人平均取 得近三份由五大會計師行發出的聘 書。

全球主要大學的會計系都以畢業 生獲得五大聘書的數目,來衡量畢業 生的競爭力。中大會計畢業生一向最 受本港五大的歡迎,佔它們聘請的本 地院校畢業生的五成;而大部分會計 畢業生在離校前五個月已獲至少一份 聘書,八成半屬於會計師行職位,其 餘為政務官、行政主任、銀行見習經 理和企業初級會計師等。

逾千名中大學生將赴海外進修交流

年將有逾千名中大學生獲得海外獎學金,到英國、美國、澳洲、加拿大、日本及瑞典等地的著名學府進修或當交換生,以擴闊視野,增廣見聞,深造知識。

校方為答謝所有海外獎學金的捐贈者,上月卅一日假香港會議展覽中心舉辦「龍騰萬里」嘉獎禮,由大學教育資助委員會主席林李翹如博士主持開展儀式,林博士並與李國章校長向獎學金捐贈者致送紀念品。約有二百人出席典禮,包括獎學金得主及他們的家人。

另,大學上月廿四日在科學館一號演講室舉行「寰宇取經 2001」開展儀式 (圖),讓三百多名學生清楚了解,他們須以開放投入的態度,去參與暑假的海外 和內地實習培訓活動,才能達至擴闊生活體驗的目的。



醫學院深造中心啟用

誌慶醫學院成立二十周年

医父 學院深造中心啟用典禮於本月二日舉行,並順誌醫學院成立二十周年。出席 典禮的嘉賓有衛生福利局局長楊永強醫生,香港賽馬會主席李福深先生,邵 氏基金會方逸華女士,繼昌堂管理信託人張朗蓀先生和鍾楗先生,威爾斯之友會 王守業夫人、雷羅慧洪女士和廖璧欣小姐,李國章校長,醫學院院長鍾尚志教 授,以及公共衛生學院院長李紹鴻教授。

深造中心座落威爾斯親王醫院,提供先進的教學、研究及訓練設施,讓醫護 人員透過學習與探索,促進本港公共衛生的發展,以應付市民對醫療服務日益增 多及不斷轉變的需求。

中心獲香港賽馬會慈善基金、邵氏基金會、威爾斯之友會及繼昌堂慷慨捐款建成,包括樓高五層的「香港中文大學賽馬會公共衛生學院」大樓,設有四百零八個座位的「逸夫講學堂」,演講廳「繼昌堂」,以及露天走廊「威友廊」等。
