Major Programme Requirement

Students are required to complete a minimum of 72 units of courses as follows:

(a) Introductory Courses: CHES1000, 1003, 1004	9
(b) Chinese Language and Culture courses: Students are required to take 6 units of Chinese language and culture courses from one of the following areas depending on the student's level of Chinese language proficiency.	6
(i) Chinese Language Foundation Students are required to take any 2 courses from the following: CHES1005, 1006, 2004, 2010, 2105, 3013	
(ii) Chinese Communication on China Students are required to take any 2 courses from the following: CHES2001, 2002, 2004, 2104, 2105, 2106	
(c) Experiential Learning Courses: CHES3300, 3400, 3403	9
(d) Research Component Courses: CHES3500, 4500 (capstone course)	6

Explanatory Notes:

1. CHES courses at 2000 and above level as included in the Major programme requirements will be included in the calculation of Major GPA for honours classification.
 2. "Chinese Language Foundation" is designated for students with no prior knowledge of Chinese language such as international students whereas "Chinese Communication on China" is for students who have studied Chinese language or are native Chinese speakers. Students are assigned to one of the study areas based on language assessment upon admission, subject to the approval of the Programme Director.
 3. Any CHES courses counted towards the fulfillment of one of the above listed requirements cannot be counted towards the fulfillment of any other requirements specified in the study scheme.
- [a] Students plan to enroll in CHES3401, 3402, 4003, 4004, 4005 must submit applications for approval by a faculty member and the Programme Director.
