# 2019-20 Course Registration, Term 1 Centre for China Studies Announcement – BA in Chinese Studies (For New Students)

#### 1. Online Add-Drop, 9 September (Mon) – 15 September (Sun)

Students should sit in on classes, study the course outline, and discuss with the course teacher before enrolling in a course. *Dropping a course(s) after the Add-Drop period will not be approved* except in very special circumstances and with clear justification. If problems arise, please contact the Programme Director as early as possible for guidance.

## 2. Final Course Register

It is the responsibility of every student to check his/her final course register once the Add-Drop period has ended.

#### 3. CHES Courses Suitable for Year 1 Students

- CHES 1000 Introduction to Chinese Studies (required course and pre-assigned)
- CHES1001 Chinese Languages, Past and Present Sound and Script (*required course and pre-assigned*)
- CHES2102 China's Business Environment in Historical Perspective
- CHES2107 Introduction to the Development of Science and Technology in China

#### 4. Chinese Language Classes

On top of the 6 units of University Core Chinese (see below item 5), additional units of Chinese language are required by the Programme as follows in accordance to the study stream.

#### **International Stream**

- Students who are <u>not</u> Chinese native-speakers fall into this study stream.
- 12 units of Putonghua (CLCP) courses are required to be taken throughout the degree study period.
- Upon language proficiency assessment and the approval of the Programme Chinese Language Advisor and the Programme Director, this requirement may also be fulfilled by taking Cantonese (CLCC) courses, Chinese translation courses or other approved course taught in Chinese across the University's curriculum.

#### Chinese Native-Speaker Stream

- Students who are Chinese native-speakers fall into this study stream.
- 6 units of Chinese language courses are required to be taken throughout the degree study period by any one of the following.
  - 1) To take 2 Cantonese (CLCC) courses for mainland Chinese students; OR 2 advanced spoken Putonghua (CLCP) courses for local students.
  - 2) To take 2 approved courses taught in Chinese at 4000 level across the University's curriculum relevant to the Major.

#### 3) To take CHES4001 and 4002.

\*All the CLCP and CLCC courses are offered by the Yale-China Chinese Language Center (CLC) located in the Leung Kau Kui Building on LG floor. The CLCP and CLCC courses cannot be enrolled on CUSIS directly, therefore, students need to visit the CLC office for course placement and enrollment.

## 5. <u>University Core Courses – Chinese and English Courses</u>

All students will be *pre-assigned* to the University Chinese and English Courses as follows. Unless in very special circumstances, students are not allowed to drop or change the pre-assigned classes. If problems arise, please contact the Centre Office as early as possible for guidance.
