

# 書院人生必修科

中大活脱是個山城。這個山城有不同書院,難得的是同一座山裡,不同書院裝載著不同土壤,培植出不同成果。伍宜孫書院(Wu Yee Sun College)培植出來的新品種,就是帶出Sunny Spirit 的 Sunnies!乘坐校巴沿林蔭小徑緩緩向上爬,走到伍宜孫書院,每個人定必都會被落地玻璃窗外的景色吸引。走到圓夢臺,從山上遠眺馬鞍山,欣賞吐露港的海天一色、陽光明媚,亦正正帶出書院的陽光精神。書院培育 Sunnies 的方法,就是強調承擔社會責任,四位同學來自不同學科級別,成長背景、性格各異,但同樣以服務社會為目標,用創意煉成膽汁,書院配合在幕後大力支持,推動同學開發新念頭,感受最真切的「萬事起頭難」、接觸不同領域、跟同伴一同初嚐「意見不合」、「高低起伏」等人生必修科。

# THE SUNNIES ON FIFID

### 一顆服務的心

如果説同學到大學讀書有如拜師學藝、修煉身 心,在中大這個山城上,伍官孫書院這個「門派」 卻非常獨特。同學的本科學業是外家功,書院傳 授的卻是內功心法。每個學生的「學有所成」, 並非著眼於「高分」,而是「高能」。他們的能 Micki 的志願是當社工,由參加活動到自行統籌 力在山下發揮到甚麼作用?怎樣透過服務社會來 感受人生最大的滿足感?方是書院的核心價值。 如何達到「高能」?書院的答案是走入人群!同 學到不同角落服務人群,初生之犢眼界大開,有 人學會謙卑,有人懂得應變,有人學會體諒,有 人變得更有責任感。透過服務人群,同學鍛鍊的 是一顆安定的心,靠自己內省,展現堅實的價值 觀。知識領域變得快,所有學科知識都要面對更 新的一日。唯獨堅實價值觀,可以令他們毋懼風 雨勇往直前。

Micki:「其實院長李沛良教授向來重視服務學 習這個宗旨,強調從服務中學習,我知道他在 崇基學院時已經提倡這套觀念,現在將它貫徹 到伍官孫。

在參與眾多服務學習計劃的過程中,我們無時無 刻都要面對很多突發情況:小朋友跟不上進度, 須立即改教材。每晚吃飯後大家還要商量翌日的 課堂。物資有問題、交通安排有問題,甚至吃的 菜有問題(有同學水土不服),這些突發的情況 令我們加快成長,學懂怎樣應變。」

不過,單單學懂應變,加速成長還不夠。書院 希望學生嚐過服務的滋味後,將那顆服務的種 子植根到自己的人生。所以 Micki 跟 Kiki 經常會 想,有更高層次的反思,究竟這些服務能否真 正幫到人?

### 等電梯等出商機

Kelly 則是一個修讀環球經濟與金融的二年級學 生,單看學科,也許會以為她活在金融世界, 滿腦數字、價位、基金……畢業後,便順理成 章到投資銀行上班,延續數字人生。不過身為 伍宜孫人,當眾多大學生只看到學分, Kelly 卻 在本科之外,擁有一個更廣闊的世界觀。這一 切,由書院一個計劃開始。

Kelly:「事情是這樣的。我性急,每次等電梯 時我都想,怎樣將等電梯的無聊時光變得有意 義?當時我覺得,現在很多大學生只想讀完書 快快畢業去找工作,對世界大事都不聞不問, 活在山城上與世隔絕。於是我想到不如弄一 部 Knowledge Vending Machine 『My 知 識 售 賣機』,同學等電梯無聊時可以邊玩邊留意世 界大事。亦適逢書院舉辦愛陽光計劃 (Sunny Passion Programme) 讓同學用創新意念參加比 賽,便一鼓作氣報名了,最後有幸奪得亞軍。」

這個計劃及後亦於數個全港及全國性的比賽中 得獎,包括環境局的獎項,書院提供場地,加 上教授的意見,和三年級的師兄義務幫忙寫程 式,現在 Knowledge Vending Machine 真的由 概念變成事實,站在書院的電梯大堂了。

Kelly:「我現在仍然會偷偷地看有沒有同學玩, 想知道他們有甚麼反應。」

同一書院中,師兄妹來自不同學科。既是書院 最大特色,同學亦從中得到最大裨益。Kelly: 「跟跨學科的師兄攜手合作,真是大挑戰!我 修讀的金融是一門商科,參與這次 Knowledge Vending Machine 的計劃,你可以實際體會到 與背景跟你完全不同的人,怎樣溝通怎樣合 作。寫程式時師兄問我想用甚麼語言,原來他 想的是程式語言; 跟有工程背景的師兄合作, 是另一個宇宙!」

書院就是這樣,提供一個機會,讓不同學科卻 志同道合的人走在一起,為著同一個目標進發。 起初希望同學關心世界,整件事看似離地,不 過跟不同的人溝通,跟自己完全不熟悉的電腦、 工程背景師兄合作,又是同學將來工作必定會 遇到的情況。一部知識售賣機讓 Kelly 親身經歷 高低起伏,整件事除了學分,甚麼都賺到了。

Kelly:「過程中當然有失望,不過回想起來, 仍然覺得是一件很青春、很熱血的事。」

### 賺錢事小 點火事大

不在大學時期燃點起那團火,更待何時?聽 Vincent 的故事,大概想不到兩年前心口掛個勇 字、強調本土特色與文化的山城士多,在今日 山下的實際商業環境裡,理念相近的 ztore、土 炮等都成為網購熱點。Vincent 不知道自己是否 這個概念的先驅,他只在乎這個世界總要有人 跨前一步,燃點起火頭,讓這團火蔓延開去。

書院這些計劃的原意是希望改變社會,改變不 是一下子就翻天覆地的。反而一個概念,像點 火一樣,可以燃點起其他大大小小的想法,改 變就是這樣逐少逐少出現。

「如果山城士多能誘發其他人,我們會很開心! 由始而終我們都沒有想過賺錢,我們只想推廣和 拉折消費者與小店的關係。讓同學可以跑出山 城,自己去捍衛心儀的小店/本土文化。所以 聽到有合作的小店跟我們說,有同學主動去幫 襯,認識他們的產品時,我們已經非常滿足。」

# 創出我天地! 學生活動資助計劃

「創出我天地!」是書院特別設立的 學生資助計劃,希望鼓勵學生構思及 舉辦符合書院核心價值「創新志業及 社會責任」的學生活動。

# 愛陽光計劃

愛陽光計劃鼓勵同學善用創意,提出 對社會有利的建議,實踐「彰顯創新 志業,承擔社會責任」的書院精神。 每支參加隊伍更會互相協作,提升項 目的可行性。愛陽光計劃不只是一項 比賽,更著重不同想法的交流。

### 上山開士多 成就社會價值

有人在大學築起自己的象牙塔,在理論上不 停打轉。不過,書院卻希望這一群 Sunnies 能夠緊貼生活,做個走入社區的行動派。 Vincent 參加了書院的「創出我天地!」學生 活動資助計劃 (Be Entrepreneurial! Funding Scheme),要做一盤最青春最熱血的生意。 參與創業的同學除了有機會磨鍊自己,盡力而 為不怕吃虧勇往直前之外,更重要的是將自己 化成一團火,燃點起更多人的熱心。

Vincent 雖然修讀法律,學科上可能要求理性 思維客觀中立,不過他當起小老闆面對一盤生 意,卻變了一輛動力火車,希望改變社會。 Vincent:「其實兩年前香港未有 ztore、土炮 之前,我們已經有『山城士多』計劃。我們挑 選本土特色小店再向同學推介,之後我們就幫 同學團購。為什麼有這個概念?因為本土小店 經營困難的議題已經講了多年,我們再受不了 香港人只會對議題不斷討論,卻無所動作,十 幾人一起就放膽一試吧。 」

創業當然辛苦,找小店、探訪、遊説合作、宣 傳、出單、送貨,山城士多內沒有人是讀商科 的,連會計也沒有,反而賣涼茶跟法律有關, 因為要領牌!不過這些經營的實務,都不夠經 歷一次又一次漫長的討論辛苦。

「如果你當這是一門生意,我們當然沒有因財 失義(這盤生意一開始就不是用錢來衡量!), 反而是因為理念上不同,一開會就沒完沒了。 慶幸山城士多沒有忘記初衷: 我們最怕只說不 做,才會開這間不賺錢的士多,不再拘泥價值 觀討論,一腔熱血想做就做,走入真實環境做 實事!否則我們就變了將議題不斷重複,卻只 説不做的人了。」

### 同一書院下 打破框架

# 服務學習計劃主任 鄧惠雄先生

書院自二零一二年第一年收生開始,已推出著重啟發和體驗的「服務學習計劃」。

過去五年,書院共組織十二個服務學習團,共一百六十十位同學分別前往四川、雲南、西安、台南、緬甸以 及柬埔寨,有計劃地為當地的偏遠社區和弱勢群體,提供多元化的義工服務,並與當地的青年人進行交流。

同學們透過上述一連串的服務學習經歷後,在其個人成長、團隊精神、領袖潛力、人文關懷,以及社會責任 感等方面,均有所提升。



# **SERVE AND INNOVATE:** THE COMPULSORY COURSE ON LIFE

Students at Wu Yee Sun College are known as the Sunnies. Characterized by their Sunny Spirit, the Sunnies are cultivated by the College with its emphasis on social responsibility. Four Sunnies, differing in their backgrounds, majors and personality, are connected by the same aspirations to serve the society. The enormous support from the College helps them incubate new ideas and utilize their boundless creativity.

### A Heart to Serve

The College values not only academic grades but also what the students could achieve once they leave campus. The society offers a myriad of adventures for those who are willing to experience and learn from them. Some learned to be humble, some learned to improvise, some learned to empathize, and some learned to be responsible.

Since his days in Chung Chi College, College Master Professor Rance P.L. Lee has upheld the key value of Service-Learning, which he has brought along to and successfully implanted in Wu Yee Sun College. As Mei-ki Lau (Micki) (Social Work/ 5) and Wai-ki Chan (Kiki) (Food and Nutritional Sciences/ Class of 2016) recalled, different challenges may arise in all Service-Learning events, like problems with materials and hiccups in transport. All these help develop their problem-solving skills and the experience eventually pushes them to learn and grow faster. But Micki and Kiki didn't stop there. They want to be sure if their services really helped anyone.

During their fourth year of study, supported by the College's Service-Learning Project Funding Scheme, they flew back to the service target school to meet up their students abroad and arranged a Christmas party for them. They have worked their way up from coordinator to leader after years of participation in the Programme, through which they learned practical and soft skills, and most importantly, they made a firm resolution to care for others. "Whatever paths we take in future, we hope to make our city a better place, where everyone could live a better life," said Micki. Service-Learning is more than just learning. It's about giving back to society.

Ka-vu Lau (Kelly) (Global Economics and Finance/ 2) studies business but she has a vision far more than mere numbers, prices or funds. She came up with an idea for a "Knowledge Vending Machine", with which her fellow schoolmates may learn about current affairs around the world while waiting for the lift. Her project has since won the Silver Award in the College's Sunny Passion Programme, and several other awards in Hong Kong and in China, including one by the Environment Bureau. The College provided the space, professors provided advice, and a schoolmate from another discipline volunteered to do the computer programming. This multidisciplinary collaboration and mutual knowledge

enrichment environment helped realize Kelly's idea and the Machine is now installed by the lift in the College. "Working with people with completely different upbringings from you makes you learn how to communicate and cooperate," said Kelly.

# A Store selling social values

The College encourages its Sunnies to feel the pulse of the community by proactively taking part in it. Yip-fung Chong (Vincent) (Laws/ 4) participated in the "Be Entrepreneurial! Funding Scheme", hoping to start an ambitious business. It was a chance for him and the other entrepreneurial beginners to put themselves on a harsh course of training and exhibit their skills, igniting their own passion as well as the others'.

Law students are trained to be logical and objective. Nevertheless, being a start-up boss sparked Vincent's inner flame and turned him into a locomotive which is driven by passion and is heading for a better society. "We couldn't accept the attitude of the majority in Hong Kong on the direction of helping out small local shops, which has no solid action beyond endless debates. Our team would rather take the chance and take action," said Vincent.

Today, internet shops with similar ideas are gaining popularity in the commercial reality outside the campus. Vincent isn't sure if he had pioneered the idea in the first place. He only cares if there is anyone willing to take the first step and spark off a movement. The ultimate goal of these projects is to bring changes to society. Changes don't happen overnight, but one idea may inspire another, and could bring changes eventually.

# A College shines in breakthrough

Life at the College is full of sunshine, sweat, hustle, and joy. Our four Sunnies, with different major studies and personality but sharing the same desire to achieve more than they could, agree that it's College's innovative approach that inspired them to break traditional boundaries. They all learned the one important mentality and value: strong sense of social awareness and responsibility.



# 香港 - 台南文化 創意探索之旅

創意實驗室與台灣國立成功大學的創 意產業設計研究所(iCiD),舉辦了 首個名為「香港 - 台南文化創意探索 之旅」的交流計劃,旨在研究兩地文 化創新產業的最新發展形式及方向, 讓參與同學能夠從中學習當地的保育 經驗,為同樣是沿海的西貢社區提出 創新而可行的方案,解決日漸加劇的 城市老化問題,而保留這個香港「後 花園」的歷史文化及特色。

# **CREATIVITY EXPERIMENTS: INCUBATING NEW MINDS**

In the middle of the Wu Yee Sun College campus stands a monumental facility. Resources from recycled wood, glass, 3D printers to electric drills are found there. This, however, is not a workshop but a laboratory. Students experimenting with their ideas here at "c!ab", the Creativity Lab, do not aim at achieving personal craftsmanship or developing a profitable business. They are here to explore possibilities - possibilities of actualizing their wildest ideas. Through countless experiments, some students learn more about themselves, some learn to empathize, and some take on a distinctly different path in life. Underlying all their bright ideas is always the intention to preserve our core values, our traditional virtues.

# Step 1: Emboldened to change the society

their wildest imaginations, which could eventually lead to concepts that reform current social norms. Students with pioneering ideas gather at this hub to see what interactions could happen

Environmental protection has always been one of the essential elements of the College. For the annual Photo Day, Lok-hei Leung (Dawn) (Journalism and Communication/ 3) had the idea of replacing the usual balloon arch by a wooden one made of recycled logs. Bouquets recycled at the end of the day were made into dried flowers. "Everyone is creative, but not everyone is bold enough to make it work. Working in clab is one of my best times in campus life," said Dawn.

# Step 2: Implant design thinking

clab has an "idea wall" posted with loads of post-it stickers, each with a peculiar idea. This is what the College values: "Design Thinking". Kin-tat Tang (Gundam) (Chemistry/ Class of 2016) recalled how a trip to Tainan had allowed students to learn the ways to actualize their designs. "With their connections in academia, our professors started with an academic conference, which in turn led to the creativity exchange tour. During the tour, we realized that in addition to profit-making business, design could be implemented in non-governmental organizations too." Dawn added, "Creativity is a tool. It helps connect physical entities to history and humanity, which arouses our sense of belonging and ultimately, the will to preserve."

"The Global Learning Award Scheme allows me to tour around Europe and visit numerous museums. The plethora of museums is eve-opening. The experience taught me to think out of the box." The experience also inspired Gundam to create a "salted-fish simulation" game in the Orientation Camp.

"The College stresses the importance of empathy too," said Candice C.Y. Ng (Journalism and Communication/2), "We learn to stand in the endusers' shoes, and it makes me think comprehensively when I'm being traditional virtues. the lead coordinator."

# Step 3: Nurturing empathy; people oriented creation

The College's emphasis on environmental protection draws students with the same perception like Sum-yue Chung (Natalie) (Geography and Resource Management/ 2), who started the local travel advice website clab, which opens 24 hours a day, is a space for students to indulge in V'air. It promotes lesser-known locations in Hong Kong to encourage local travelling in order to reduce the need to travel abroad, and thus minimize the carbon footprint. "The General Education course offered by the College enriched my knowledge and encouraged me to join various competitions." She interviewed numerous citizens in public and found out most people know very little about local attractions. Utilizing their expertise, her team made the V'air, a local travel website with a touch of social responsibility. "We thank the College for providing a platform to gather talented partners in the University, as well as providing connections to us, from acquiring professional advice to media

# Step 4: Through trial and error

The critical lesson learned in the College is the will to try, and the mind to accept failures. "The College Master repeatedly advised on the importance of learning how to accept failure. After years of lessons learned in the College. I am calmer now when facing setbacks. Failure is not always inexplicable, nor is it the end. We should keep up and work harder until more people see the full picture," said Gundam.

"Even if sometimes our imaginations are too wild, the College provides detailed explanation on possible limitations in reality and risk analysis to make us understand fancy ideas do not equate with thoughtless actions " said Dawn

"I used to point the finger at and hold a grudge on failures. Through participating in various projects and talking with many different people, I learn to be in other's shoes and understand everyone has his own difficulties." said Candice.

Modern education nowadays is being criticized for indoctrinating instead of educating, cloning instead of enlightening. Here in clab, we are nourishing a new breed, which will be creative, empathetic, courageous, compassionate, studious, steadfast, and with the heart to preserve




# **CUHK Store**

中大於二零零七年厚蒙伍宜孫慈善基金會捐款,在校園西部的翠綠山坡上成 立伍宜孫書院,而我有幸獲邀加入由劉遵義校長主持的書院籌劃委員會,與 各委員共商書院發展的抱負和方向。當時,我是社會學系教授和系主任,於 二零零九年中才退休。二零一零年春天劉遵義校長力勸我為母校再盡綿力, 出任伍宜孫書院的創院院長。我初時婉拒,恐怕力不從心。然而,劉校長能 言善辯,盛情難卻。再三思量後,我終於答應了。上任後首要任務是組班。 我很幸運,得到幾所老書院的支持,尤其是其院長的諒解,有不少老師和校 友得以相繼加盟伍宜孫書院,各展所長,群策群力,將我們的夢想化為實際 計劃,建立了一所彰顯創意創新和綠化生活以及社會責任的新書院。

Wu Yee Sun College, which is now situated in the western part of the University campus, was established in 2007 with the generous support from the Wu Yee Sun Charitable Foundation. I was invited by Professor Lawrence J.Y. Lau, the then Vice-Chancellor, to join the College Planning Committee he was chairing, to deliberate on the mission and vision of the new college. At that time, I was Professor and Department Chair at the Department of Sociology, until my retirement in mid-2009. In spring 2010. Professor Lau enthusiastically invited me to continue to serve my alma mater as the Founding Master of Wu Yee Sun College. I had declined his invitation at first, thinking that the job would be physically too demanding for me. However, Professor Lau was so persuasive that eventually I was convinced and took up the position. My first mission as College Master was to form our team and I was grateful for the support from the founding colleges of the University. The College Heads have been very understanding, which have allowed many teaching staff members and alumni with different expertise to join our College. Together we have turned our dream into a solid blueprint, leading to a new college today that promotes creativity, entrepreneurship, green living, as well as social responsibility.

As our team grew, the College campus was also taking shape. It has never been easy to construct a college building on a hillside. Careful planning was needed for every step in the development process -

from architectural planning, foundation laying, space allocation, to landscape design - so that our students can enjoy their fruitful college life in this campus as their second home.

In the past ten years, our members, students and alumni had identified with our College's mission and worked wholeheartedly for the development of the College, Looking back, it is their collective support and contribution which I am most proud of. In 2012, the first cohort of students was admitted to the College, and strived to build their own traditions together with teachers and alumni. Despite the setbacks they experienced, they persevered and built an excellent foundation for the College's future while chasing their own dreams.

To realize our dreams, strategies and innovation are essential, while a broad horizon with global perspective and both physical and mental health are equally important. For this reason, the College focuses on creativity, sunny living, global exposure and experiential learning for student development, preparing students to pursue their dreams. As I have stressed from time to time, while professional knowledge is important, soft skills are also indispensable. Therefore, we set up the Creativity Lab to encourage collaboration among students from different disciplines. Various sponsorship schemes are also provided for students to broaden their horizons through exchange programmes. Meanwhile, the College received support from different parties to set up service-learning and internship programmes to offer students experiential learning opportunities. To take care of the mental and physical wellness of students, the House of Sunny Living was set up to promote green living style, health and spiritual well-being, and sports for life so that students can always face different challenges with optimal performance.

Throughout these years, our students have not failed us. Many of them have been high achievers in different areas including academic, sports, creativity and arts. Even more impressive is that increasingly many students have internalized the College Spirit and made use of their creativity to propose numerous ideas and projects that may benefit our society. Many of these proposals are recognized for their potential and some are given the opportunity to be implemented, allowing students to realize their social responsibility.

The number of students in the College has grown from 300 in the very beginning to 1,200 in four years. We have also bid farewell to our first batch of graduates last year. It is the most beautiful dream come true. to see our Founding Sunnies grow, complete their studies and realize the College Spirit in their life. Without the support of College members, students, alumni and friends, it would be impossible for us to make it. Looking back on the past decade, my wonderful journey with the College, with my dream realized here, makes my best memories in CUHK. During my Headship at Chung Chi College from 1994 to 2004, I witnessed the construction of Lake Ad Excellentiam which is now one of the landmarks in the University. Last year, I named the podium of the Wu Yee Sun College campus as the Terrace of Dreams, which has now become another landmark with its excellent view. From then to now, my dream has been fulfilled.







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
