Prof. Donald BRENNEIS is a Professor of Anthropology at the University of California, Santa Cruz. His work has focused on the social life of communicative practices—linguistic, musical, performative, and textual.

Prof. William JANKOWIAK is Barrick Distinguished Professor of anthropology at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. His research interests include urban Chinese society, urban Mongols, Mormon fundamentalist polygyny, and love around the world.

Prof. Ichiro NUMAZAKI is a Professor of the Cultural Anthropology Program at the Tohoku University. His current research interests include Post-Imperialism/Post-Colonialism in/of Taiwan and Japan, and the intellectual history of American Anthropology, especially of cultural relativism.

Prof. Anne UNDERHILL is a Professor of Anthropology at Yale University. She specializes in the archaeology of East Asia (primarily China). Her archaeological research interests include investigation of craft production, exchange systems, diet, and mortuary ritual.
