

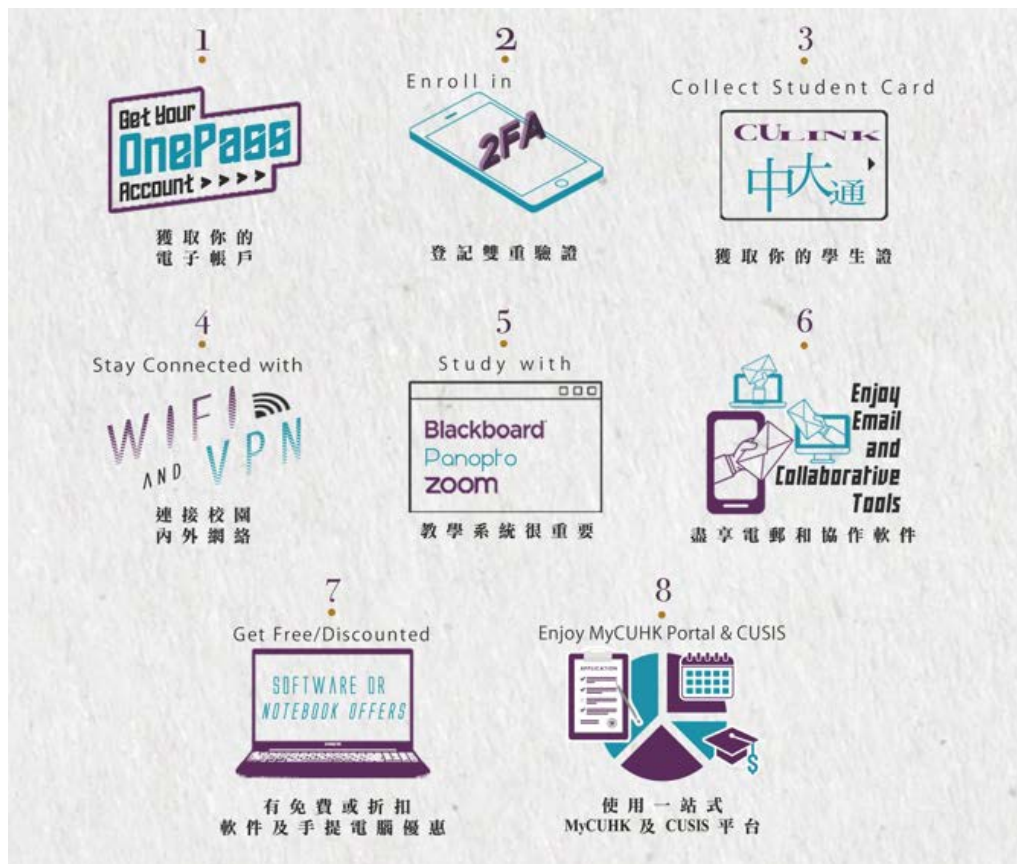
c. Typhoon and adverse weather arrangement

Appendix 2 - Study Scheme

Study Scheme*

(Applicable to students admitted in 2022-23 and thereafter)

1. Coursework Requirement

Students are required to complete a minimum of 24 units of courses for graduation. Out of the 24 units, at least 18 units must be RELS-coded courses.

(i) Required course:

RELS5005

(ii) Elective courses:

Any Seven courses from the Four Areas prescribed in the course list with at least TWO Areas chosen from Area 1, 2 and 3.

2. Other Requirements

(a) Students must fulfill the Term Assessment Requirement of the Graduate School. For details, please refer to Clause 13.0 "Unsatisfactory Performance and Discontinuation of Studies" of the General Regulations Governing Postgraduate Studies which can be accessed from the Graduate School Homepage: <http://www.gs.cuhk.edu.hk>.

(b) Students must take at least one course per term throughout the normative study period stipulated in the "General Regulations Governing Postgraduate Studies".

(c) A student must achieve a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of at least 2.0 in order to fulfill the graduation requirement, unless special approval is granted by the Graduate Council.

*Students should consult the student handbook from the Graduate School for details of programme requirements.
