Target: Applicants applying for MPhil/PhD programme in Physics or Materials

Science and Engineering (Fall 2026 entry)

Contents: Lectures, lab tours, experience sharing, and admission interview

Fees: Free of charge. Accommodation will be provided for non-local applicants.

Admission Requirements for MPhil/PhD Programme:

- ➤ Bachelor's or Master's degree in related disciplines (by the time of admission), with a good major GPA (typically 3.2 out of 4.0 or above) <u>OR</u> a good honors degree (typically Second Class Upper Division or above).
- ➤ Fulfill the English language proficiency requirement, e.g., provide TOEFL (iBT: ≥79) or IELTS (Band ≥6.5) score report. [Note: No need to submit English test scores at the time of application.]
- > Optional: Score 850 or above in GRE Subject Test ("Physics", "Chemistry", "Mathematics").

Financial Support for Research Postgraduate Students:

- Admitted students will be provided a monthly studentship of HKD19,100 (2025-26) and medical benefits.
- ➤ Outstanding students will be recommended to compete for Hong Kong PhD Fellowship Scheme (https://cerg1.ugc.edu.hk/hkpfs/). Awardees will be provided a monthly studentship of HK\$28,100 (2025-26) and a conference travel allowance of HK\$14,000 per year.
